Our guests included Democratic Congressman Jason Altmire, who managed to survive the Republican congressional victory sweep, and who maintained significant distance between his own political positions and that of the White House and the Congress. Altmire told us that he will oppose House Speaker Nancy Pelosi's bid to become House Minority Leader. Our other guest, Congressman Tim Murphy, longtime conservative Republican from the South Hills, talked about difficulties in trying to work with Democratic congressional leadership and the White House.

Topic: As the Pennsylvania legislature continues to refuse to address funding shortfalls for mass transit and roads and bridges in the Commonwealth, and as we approach the end of the year, it seems more likely that Port Authority will have to institute large cuts in service and personnel, as well as fare hikes. This could result in the inability of workers to reach their jobs, doctors' appointments for the elderly and poor, and impact the general quality of life in the Commonwealth. Our guests included Port Authority CEO Steve Bland and PAT Board Member Richard Taylor. At the last-minute, Pennsylvania Governor Ed Rendell (D) moved some funding from another area to transit and the severity of these proposed cuts were lessened; some of the cuts were put on hold. However, fare hikes still went into effect at the beginning of the year. Rendell left the responsibility of future budget cuts to a Republican governor, state house, and state senate.

Last-minute maneuvering of the budget by outgoing Pennsylvania Governor (D) Ed Rendell managed to lessen the severity of service cuts, but the long-term funding for Port Authority remains grim.

Topic: The Allegheny County Port Authority is faced with the prospect of severe service and personnel cuts, and Pennsylvania's roads and bridges are in a deteriorating condition, according to information from a report by TRIP or "The Road Information Program" which studies the conditions of roads and bridges. All of this comes from the failure of the Pennsylvania legislature to provide adequate funding for transportation across the board in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It's a problem that can only grow when a conservative governor, house and senate take office in January. We spoke with representatives of the Mon Valley Progress Council, the Pittsburgh Community Reinvestment Group, and the Pittsburgh Downtown Partnership, about the impact of all of this on the average citizen who must travel for work or other necessities.

3. PITTSBURGH PENSION FUND

Topics discussed in this category included the city's underfunded pension fund, and controversial efforts to sell city assets to help fund the pension shortfall.

Ravenstahl favored selling these city assets for privatization for quick money up front. City council members opposed this plan and were working for an alternative solution to the problem. City council's finance chairman Bill Peduto, member of council from the 8th District (much of the East End), talked about the roots of this problem, and one possibility of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania seizing control of the Pittsburgh City Pension Fund if no agreement is reached with the mayor by the end of the year.

Council and City Controller Michael Lamb crafted an alternative proposal which Natalia Rudiak (D) Pittsburgh city council member from the South Hills, and Controller Lamb explained in their appearance with us.

Jamie Gallegos, a native of Brighton Township, Beaver County, married her high school sweetheart, had two children, and moved to Arizona. About two weeks before this broadcast, Gallegos who divorced and later remarried was taking her two sons ages seven and ten to karate practice when she was confronted by her former husband in the parking lot of a church. He shot and killed her in front of the children and the next day killed himself. His body was found in a car in the Arizona desert. We

discussed the "dirty little secret" of domestic violence and its impact on the workplace with Janet Scott-Mace from the Women's Center & Shelter of Greater Pittsburgh, Jill Marsilio-Colonna, Executive Director of the Women's Center of Beaver County, and Dr. Patricia Cluss, psychologist and director of "Standing Firm", a University of Pittsburgh initiative to teach the impact of domestic/partner violence on productivity in the workplace.

Topic: The world's attention was focused on miraculous efforts to rescue 33 trapped miners from the San Jose Copper Mine in Copiapo, Chile. The center of that activity was a place called "Camp Hope". Our guests have extensive experience in planning and carrying out mine rescues and treating the survivors. Joe Sbaffoni led the rescue effort in July 2002 of the Que Creek miners in Somerset County, Pennsylvania. Dr. Antonio Zikos was primarily responsible for the care of the sole survivor of the Sago Mine Disaster in West Virginia in 2006. Our guests discussed the contrasts and similarities between these rescues and the effort to free the miners from the Chilean mine.

Topic: The United States Supreme Court is considering a very controversial case which pits the First Amendment against the rights of those mourning the deaths of soldiers who have been killed while fighting in Afghanistan and Iraq. This case was sparked by protests by the Westboro Baptist Church of Topeka, Kansas, an anti-gay group. That church believes that soldiers are dying in those countries because God is punishing America for tolerating gays. Followers have protested at hundreds of military funerals in this country. One of our guests, Jim Coster, is both an attorney and an Iraq War veteran, as well as a veteran of the U.S. Marine Corps and the Pennsylvania National Guard. Robert Barker is a distinguished professor of law at Duquesne University.

17. HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE

Pittsburgh's historic Civic Arena (also known for some time as the Mellon Arena) has hosted every event from a concert by the Beatles to the Home Show, wrestling, the circus, Easter sunrise services, and the Pittsburgh Civic Light Opera (the purpose for which it was originally built), not to mention Stanley Cup championship hockey games by the Pittsburgh Penguins. However, with the completion of the Penguins' CONSOL Energy Center, the Civic Arena, with the only retractable roof of its kind in the world, could soon face the wrecking ball. Some Hill District residents, still angry over displacement of part of the population when the Arena was built, in the early 19050's, the Pittsburgh Penguins, and the Sports & Exhibition Authority want the Arena to be demolished, for economic development. However, local architect Rob Pfaffmann is proposing a creative use of the roof and the property, and local Hill District advocate Dr. Kimberly Ellis wants the community to hear a full series of options for the property.

Cunningham's company provides instruments and services for protecting workers from hazardous gases in industrial settings such as chemical plants, refineries, and mines. Cunningham told us about his struggle to return to Pittsburgh from France, including hopping a train almost as a stowaway.
