Practical ways for parents to highlight inner beauty and encourage daughters to see themselves and others as God does.

Though he was determined not to fall into the same patterns, he found himself stuck in alcoholism and on the brink of losing his wife... until she accepted the wisdom of a caring pastor, set courageous boundaries, and showed forgiveness which drew Jimmy to Jesus and brought new life to their marriage.

Also, a segment on Middle Eastern current events and foreign policy.

Stonestreet explores impacts of conflated terms and the types of diversity that are championed, those which are excluded, and how fears of litigation are often a driving force.

He says many people who set out to budget expenses identify incoming funds and categories of spending accurately, but give up when expenses that seem necessary are higher than the budget can accommodate. He offers specific strategies to save money on clothing, utilities, and home maintenance.
