SECTION I. Issues

- A) **COVID-19** Minnesota's COVID-19 peacetime emergency has been extended through April 14th as the number of people receiving the vaccine increases. The latest update from the Minnesota Department of Health shows 28.6 percent of Minnesotans have received at least one vaccine dose while 80.7 percent of Minnesotans 65 and older have received at least one vaccine dose. Every Minnesotan, 16 and older, is currently eligible for the shot. COVID restrictions were loosened on March 15th upping the capacity for bars and restaurants to 75%. New capacity limits for outdoor events took effect on April 1st.
- B) **Food Crisis** More Minnesotans visited food shelves in 2020 than any year on record. That demand hasn't declined through the first quarter of 2021. Feedingamerica.org says, 461,200 people are struggling with hunger in Minnesota and of them 161,880 are children.
- C) **Mental Health** –The pandemic continues to take a toll on the emotional well-being of Minnesotans. Mental Health Minnesota says the number of people seeking mental health treatment jumped significantly in 2020 and the use of the Minnesota Mental Health Helpline, which provides information and referrals, has doubled since 2019.
- D) **Speeding** Department of Public Safety's Director of Traffic Safety Mike Hanson said fatal crashes increased significantly in 2020 and that trend continued through the first quarter of 2021 excessive speed is the leading cause. The Minnesota State Patrol says, troopers have given out 2,355 more speeding tickets this year than they did this time last year.
- E) **Fire Prevention** Minnesota public safety officials say fire deaths in 2020 were up 13% over the previous year and the leading cause of fatal fires in Minnesota is careless smoking.
