#### WXBT Quarterly Issues/Programs List

WXBT provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- American Red Cross: This week on Carolina Cares with Tyler Ryan, we learn about the many programs of the American Red Cross, well beyond the "giving the gift of life" mantra that is the second most recognizable logo and mission on the planet Maya Franklin joins Tyler to talk about blood, house fires, and the reality of disasters like Irma, and the response of the organization created by a nurse in 1881.
- Camp Cole: Tyler Ryan speaks with the Co-Founders of Camp Cole, Kelsey Carter and Margret-Deans Grants. Camp Cole is a 60+ acre camp located between Columbia and Sumter, that is focused on providing camping experiences for children with long-term healthcare needs and terminal illnesses, as well as adults with Autism and First Responders dealing with PTSD and other service related issues.
- Columbia City Ballet: Tyler Ryan visits with the Executive Director of the Columbia City Ballet / South Carolina Ballet William Starrett about his journey to the top of the ballet world, and his nearly 40 years building South Carolina's largest performing arts organization. The two discuss the history of ballet, and the annual favorite performance of The Nutcracker, which tours throughout the Palmetto State.
- Habitat for Humanity: Discussed programs and services not only for South Carolina, but have an international footprint. Dispelled myths about Habitat, and how you can get involved.
- Internet Against Children Task Force: Tyler Ryan speaks with former Deputy Attorney General and current 5th Circuit Prosecutor Bethany Miles about work on the Internet Against Children Task Force, the elite team that works to defend children against predators. Tyler and Assistant Solicitor Miles talk about how apps and technology have created opportunities for people who have the mindset to hurt kids. They also discuss the laws surrounding this delicate subject. Assistant Solicitor Miles offers ideas on starting a difficult conversation with children about the dangers on the Internet. The two also discuss Milestone of South Carolina, a non-profit organization that Ms. Miles founded to help children in the Foster Care System in South Carolina, providing support and resources for the kids and host families.
