Kidney Disease – 03/21/16 - TFN

:60 spot There is a progressive and potentially fatal health condition that effects one in seven American adults, and causes more deaths annually than either breast cancer or prostate cancer. One third of Americans are at risk of developing this disease, and yet the symptoms are so difficult to detect that most people don't even know they have it until they become critically ill and require emergency medical intervention. Can you guess what it is? It's chronic kidney disease, a preventable and treatable condition that takes a terrible toll on overall health and quality of life for millions of Americans.

Our kidneys play a vital role in keeping us healthy and ensuring our bodies work properly. Their primary function is to filter wastes and extra water out of our blood to make urine. Children's Eye Health 09/05/18 – TFN

One in four children have vision problems that, if left untreated, may result in learning issues and hinder development and academic performance in school. All children, even those with no signs of trouble, should have their eyes checked during the first few years of life, before entering kindergarten, and throughout the school years. Signs of vision problems include squinting while reading or watching TV, frequently rubbing the eyes, one eye appearing crossed or looking outwards, or issues reading or writing. Watch for digital eye strain, which is caused by prolonged use of computers or smartphones and can cause dry eyes, blurred vision or headaches. Keep digital screens at least 30 inches away from your eyes and rest your eyes every 20 minutes. For adults and children, early detection and treatment of vision problems can save the gift of sight, while a comprehensive eye exam can help uncover health conditions not usually associated with the eyes, including juvenile rheumatoid arthritis. Ministry Matters – 28:00 minutes – Saturday 1:00 p.m. & 8:30 p.m. – 11/10/18

Host: Randy Garcia, Guest: Mario Nova of Living Faith Church speaking at “Man up” conference.

He started talking about 90% of men say they love God but only 35% go to church. One in five women will be in church without a man every Sunday. In other religions men are prominent. He feels there is not enough risk in our churches today for men, churches need to exemplify men. Women want security and men want adventure. Most men enjoy conflict even as Paul and Peter in the Bible.

Jesus attracted men. He used men because he was a REAL man. To each man in this room, “Be the man of God.” He quoted Ezekiel 2:1.

His suggestions to men: 1: “Be the man that stands up.” Be models, service one another, use God’s word as a standard, fear God and walk with him as a man and be full of His Spirit. 2.”Be the man that listens up”, hear God’s voice as Jesus calls you. He knows you and you know his voice. He quoted a verse in 1Corinhtian, Do everything in love. Not just say “love”. Be like Christ and be a man! 3: “Be the man that rises up.” Ezekiel 22:30. Host Pastor Randy Garcia, Guest: Rhoda Schultz, author of “Lost and found, the Prodigals journey home.”

The basic idea for the book was her journey with her son 7 years ago. She felt isolated and alone and lots of parents weren't talking about this shameful season in his life. He became involved in alcohol and drugs and they persued him. "He was a prodigal son but he was valuable to us and the Lord." He was confused and disoriented and they were Godly and compliant. She felt the promises of God were true but worried about her younger children during this time. Her web site is RhodaSchultz.com and the book can be bought and on Amazon.

While she saw beauty in other families, hers was in chaos. She learned it was her perception and she needed daily to regain authority over it. She felt the deep working of the Holy Spirit and prayer as God works together for good.

Rhoda feels she had a “God assignment”. To do something with God, prayer, ministry, relational and the pouring out of the Holy Spirit. Her son ended up in jail for 11 months. She drove him from jail, to work, to college and home and fixing him meals along the way. Finally he came back to the Lord. The Lord gave her extra grace and helped her forgive and get over herself or she may have lost her son.

She came up with the book idea at her son's church when she felt the pastor speaking to her. She accepted God's assignment and brought Him glory. It made her family and younger children grow closer to God and they told her afterward that they felt it would all be okay and the Lord would deliver him. It was a unique season and they tried to show the son as worthy of love.

At the end of the book is a 21 day devotional that helped her through hard times. “Pray while acting.” said Rhoda.
