1. Program Title: DISTANT ROADS Broadcast Days: Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday Broadcast Times: 11:00 AM & 07:00 PM (ET) Ages: 13-16 Episode Total Run Time: 30 minutes Total Broadcasts: 120

DESCRIPTION: Distant Roads is an educational/informational (E/I) TV series which embraces the spirit of adventure and discovery. Viewers share in the personal experiences of the show's hosts as they travel through the featured regions. The hosts reveal in depth the cultural and historical perspectives of the region while pointing out the geography, geology, and other educational details of the various destinations. Shot and edited in the style of other popular, educational programming like Modern Marvels, Travel Thru History's compelling backstories, and upbeat young narrator, entices young adults to learn more about American. history. Episodes focus on American cities that have more than natural beauty and theme parks to offer, The series uses beautiful photography and brief well-edited interviews with curators and other on-site authorities, as well as graphics, archival photography, and film footage, to set a pace that keeps a busy young mind engaged.

Part science lesson and part travelogue, ITO creates pathways to environmental awareness and outdoor lifestyles that empower our next generation to become sustainable stewards of Planet Earth while empowering today's youth to think critically about our planet. The series also highlights the history of different regions of the country while providing important facts about each place visited.
