Description: Contraband Days is one of Louisiana's largest festivals and the City of Lake Charles oldest festival and is celebrating its 57th year in 2014. Contraband Days is a themed "pirate" festival with close to 100 events. Contraband Days always falls on the first two weekends in May and it's a twelve day festival. The Festival is based on the Lake Charles Civic Center grounds with some events occurring throughout the City. Over 100,000 people attend Contraband Days Festival on land and on the water. In 1957 a group of local businessmen from the Downtown Division of the Lake Charles Association of Commerce (later known as the Chamber of Commerce) formed Lake Charles Contraband Days Inc (later known as Contraband Days Inc) for the sole purpose of developing a program to utilize the Lake Charles areas in recreational and cultural activities and to attract tourists. The group opted for a pirate theme with the LEGEND of Lafitte's Buried Treasure along Contraband Bayou thus the first Annual Contraband Days was held in June 1958 as a one day event with a boat parade, water ski show and boat races. A few years later this group of men formed another organization called the Buccaneers of Lake Charles, Inc and added entertainment by dressing in pirate attire and costume. A "Jean Lafitte" would be selected to lead the buccaneers to "Capture the Mayor and take over the City". Part of the buccaneer group would also dress in "City Militia" attire, armed with real cannons to try to ward off Lafitte & his buccaneers from landing as part of the entertainment. The Buccaneers of Lake Charles is the primary part of the festivals "pirate themed" entertainment, begins and ends the festivities, and promotes the festival year round. Contraband Days Inc. is the organization that plans, organizes, and budgets for the festivals events Forty eight years later Contraband Days has grown from a one day to a twelve day festival with close to 100 events. Contraband Days Festival grew over the years as a scheduler of many types of events, contests, and attractions. Charitable organizations were and still are encouraged to host an event during Contraband Days. Charitable organizations, schools, and churches host events, contests, booths, etc during Contraband Days and some have been involved for many years. Louisiana's highway safety program is designed to reduce traffic crashes and the resulting deaths, injuries and property damage. Programs and projects are administered in accordance with uniform guidelines promulgated by the NHTSA and FHWA. Projects implemented by the LHSC are limited to priority program areas, based on severity of the crash, over-representation, and magnitude of the problem. Pick-up trucks comprise 25 percent of the vehicle fleet in Louisiana. State observation surveys and fatality data show that pickup truck drivers and passengers fall well behind occupants of other kinds of passenger vehicles when it comes to wearing seat belts. Pick-up trucks are two times more likely to rollover than cars in fatal crashes. The LHSC is funding a high-visibility enforcement and awareness campaign to encourage seat belt usage and reduce unrestrained fatalities among our pick-up truck drivers and passengers. **Description:** Commissioner of Insurance Jim Donelon is conducting his annual statewide public awareness campaign to encourage preparations for the upcoming hurricane season and remind citizens that now is the time for property owners to review their insurance policies and make plans to protect their property and family.

"Louisiana was fortunate to have a mild hurricane season last year, and while we hope for a mild season as forecast this year, by no means should we become complacent," says Commissioner Donelon. "You may recall that Hurricane Isaac in 2012 was only a Category 1 storm, but the losses in southeast Louisiana amounted to insurers paying out about \$750 million in homeowners claims with another \$330 million in flood claims being paid by the National Flood Insurance Program." Commissioner Donelon advises property owners to take the following three steps to prepare for hurricane season: Review your insurance coverage and deductibles; If you don't already have it, look into flood insurance; and Take a home inventory. Donelon also encourages policyholders to take steps to mitigate their property. "Homeowners should also be aware of storm mitigation efforts that can go a long way in protecting their homes from storm damage and provide insurance premium discounts as well," said Donelon.

Insurance premium discounts are available for building or retrofitting a home to comply with the Louisiana State Uniform Construction Code. Qualifying elements include particular roof designs, shingles, windows, shutters, and hurricane straps incorporated in the framing process. These discounts apply to one or two-family owner occupied homes and modular homes and are generally about 20 percent of your premium cost. A certified wind mitigation surveyor must inspect your property and file a report that qualifies you for the insurance premium discounts.
