

Humboldt State University Issues Report for Second Quarter 2019

Humboldt State University reorganized KHSU, KHSB and KHSR in April, 2019 in order to provide stronger news and public affairs programming to our communities of service. Both terrestrial and on-line metrics consistently showed that our listeners preferred news and public affairs programming to entertainment shows.

Consequently, where our previous Issues Reports listed KHSU, KHSB, and KHSR as broadcasting 63 hours a week of news and public affairs programming, for the second quarter of 2019, HSU is reporting 19 hours of news and information programming each day on weekdays, and 14 hours a day on weekends. **The total of 123 hours a week of news and information programming was nearly double in the April-July 2019 quarter what it was in previous quarters.**

KHSU BBC (KHSF and KHSQ) broadcasts 168 hours a week of national and international news, public affairs, and arts and culture programming.

KHSM (Radio Bilingue Northcoast) broadcasts 168 hours of bilingual news, public affairs, and entertainment.

In addition, Humboldt State University stations are a part of the Emergency Alert System and air the required weekly and monthly EAS tests, as well as the annual nationwide EAS test.
