## **ERCOT Outages Report**

ERCOT, the agency responsible for managing the flow of electricity in Texas is out with a new preliminary report focused on the massive grid failures back in February. Millions of people were left in the dark and the state health department says at least 125 people died as a result. ERCOT notes these outages didn't all happen at once, but rather plants were going down and coming back up over the course of five days. As we've reported, ERCOT was less than 5 minutes from a statewide grid failure. What this report does not do is spell out which specific plants went because of weather and which went down for other reasons. Lawmakers are still pushing for a lot of answers as they work on reshaping ERCOT and the public utility commission which oversees ERCOT.

The pastor Jose Ortega told us the girls were upset about the move.

Houston Mayor Sylvester Turner and Chief Troy Finner outline major changes to policies and procedures in the first steps to reforming the Houston Police Department. This comes as the Texas senate also takes a step toward reform, voting to ban police choke holds. Senate Bill 69 - prohibits officers from applying pressure to a suspect's neck, throat, or torso in such a way as to block breathing or blood flow except if it's necessary to protect officers or bystanders from death or serious injury. This bill now heads to the state house.

Now to the latest on a disturbing story about a Harris County Precinct 1 Sergeant under investigation for child sex abuse. This morning, we are hearing from the precinct's constable after that sergeant took his own life. KPRC 2 Investigates learned Sergeant Robert Johnson was the subject of a criminal investigation that started Tuesday involving the sexual abuse of children. On Wednesday, after a routine traffic stop in north Liberty County, investigators say Johnson created a standoff, made phone calls confessing to the assault allegations, and implicated other adults in the sexual abuse, he then took his own life. We spoke to a woman who had been in a previous long-term relationship with Johnson. She says she is concerned about the children of other women Johnson had relationships with.

They're not the only hospital to mandate the vaccine KPRC legal analyst Brian Wice has said employers can require you to be vaccinated. However, in the new lawsuit, the employees claim they're being used as human guinea pigs, as a condition for continued employment. Tonight, the hospital network's president, Doctor Marc Boom, says 99-percent of the employees have gotten the vaccine and says, in part, " it is unfortunate that the few remaining employees who refuse to get vaccinated and put our patients first, are responding in this way. It is legal for health care institutions to mandate vaccines, as we have done with the flu vaccine since 2009."
