#### Issue: Environmental Issues

Program Overview: A big topic in Door and Kewaunee County concerns groundwater issues as they relate to manure spreading. During our news segments, we talked to farmers who spread manure and to people who are affected by manure spreading. Kewaunee County passed legislation banning manure spreading for close to four months to start the year in some areas and conducted a series of workgroup meetings with various stakeholders trying to find a solution to all of the problems going on in the area. Kewaunee County's inclusion in a national marine sanctuary and a recently discussed biogas plant has also engaged the community in discussing. We began running PSAs for the Climate Change Coalition regarding some of the programming they have and also to raise awareness of climate change in our community.

These were four 90-120 second segments tackling a big financial issue. Our news department took the highlights and wrote a weekly column on the topic documented below. This is paired with Pustaver's PSAs which air every day four times. We also periodically talk to other financial advisers in the area to talk about upcoming programs they may have or a local spin on a national or international topic.
