## Issues

**KIAK-FM** provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- Alaskan Archeology: Professor Ben Potter, UAF Assoc. Professor of Anthropology, discussed the earliest known Alaskans: how they migrated, structured their societies, and how they learned about (the remains of their dwellings and food sources). Also, he talked about what is known about their languages.
- Environment/Transportation: Sheng Zhao, UAF, and the Alaska Technical Assistance Program Center, Center for Environmentally Sustainable Transportation in Cold Climates and the Alaska Local Technical Assistance Program Center, hosted a workshop that engaged participants with various topics on transportation infrastructure in a rural and cold environment.
- Pesticide Safety: Phil Kaspari, Cooperative Extension, discussed pesticide safety.
- Public Health/Medical Issues/Child Welfare: Michael Harris, UAF Film and Native Culture Program, talked about the continued research at the University of Alaska Fairbanks regarding sudden infant death (SIDS).
- Public Safety: Officer Robert Hall and his dog Stryker, discussed the role of K9 units in local law enforcement and raising funds for the next dog for the force.
- Summer Food Safety: Roxie Rogers Dinstel, Cooperative Extension, talked about summer food safety when grilling and canning.
- Volunteerism: the need for volunteers who are supporting local and global non-profit organizations and the amazing work they do.

Both of her parents and her brothers were daily drinkers. She eventually lost her oldest brother to alcoholism. When she her surviving brother decided to get sober, her parents could not understand why they stopped drinking.  Dylan grew up in an immediate family in which nobody drank. What he came to learn is that his parents were so damaged by other relatives who were addicts and that they didn't know how to act any differently despite their non-substance abuse.
