Issues

KIAK-FM provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- Children Programs/Volunteering: Lori Wilson, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, discussed National Volunteer Month and the programs of Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Fairbanks.
- Economic Development: Gene Therriault, spokesman for the Interior Energy Project, talked about the Alaska Industrial Development & Export Authority is now working on a natural gas liquefaction plan on the North Slope and an LNG distribution system within the FNSB and into the Interior.
- Local Arts/Local Oral History Project: Rob Prince, UAF Journalist, talked about a local oral history project. Edward Zilberkant, Director & Conductor for UAF Music Dept., talked about the local arts and the International Piano Competition in Fairbanks.

Cynthia thinks her first drink was age 4 or 5. When she drank, her teenage insecurities melted away and she felt different, funny popular and sexy. John says his first drink was a child, at church. He was never comfortable with himself and thought it's odd that a child could detest himself so much. His drinking lead to deathly health problems that lead John to finally seek sobriety. Maggie's first experience with alcoholism was when she was a child. Her own mother died of alcohol-related illnesses at the age of 27. He found something that caused insatiability with him & very quickly became a daily user of meth. Bob says his use of crystal meth stems from a desire to be accepted. He is the gay son of southern Baptist blue-collar military parents. 		money to cover the debts. At age 57, she wound up in prison		
		for her crimes.

		cocaine, heroin and the discos. His narcotics use would		
		continue for 16 years when he would end up in prison.		
		Shane recalls he never fit in with his community; not his		
		neighborhood or even his family. He tried AA but he didn't buy		
		into the program & eventually started to drink and use drugs		
		again. He hit lowest when beating up his girlfriend, who was		
		trying to keep his drugs away from him.		
		Dave started drinking at a late age but it wasn't enough. He		
		tried all sorts of drugs, but cocaine became his "drug of no-		
		choice." He eventually went to rehab but during a meeting, he'd		
		do a line of coke in the bathroom.		
		Raoul is a 15 year old young man in recovery. The issue of his		
		using drugs came up at a family therapy session, and he was		
		sent off to live at a rehab community with other kids, where he		
		learned how to defeat the regular drug tests.

		Nicki first used methamphetamine at age 13. At age 16, she re-		
		acquainted with childhood friend Nick, who had long since		
		stopped using drugs. The two became involved and became		
		parents, but wound up using meth together while caring for a		
		baby.
