**KIAK-FM** provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Native Organizations/Cultural Diversity:** Indigenous studies programs and unanimous support acknowledges how contributions of Alaska Native peoples and indigenous knowledge enhance education.
- **New Drug Addiction Treatment:** New substance abuse medication is emerging as preferred drug to treat opioid addiction.
- **Domestic Violence:** Program that helps those who commit domestic violence or abuse.
- **Vocational Education:** The non-traditional student vocational education was discussed.
- **Veterans & Active-Duty Military:** Program to offer therapeutic intervention by teaching veterans how to train service dogs.
