Public Safety: Home invasion crimes are on the rise in Fairbanks. Safety in our homes and in our cars is more prevalent now than ever before.

Native Subsistence: The declining seal population and the impact it will have on native subsistence.

Pioneers of Alaska: The preservation of Alaska's history is vital so future generations will not forget its languages, customs and lineage.
