Dear Edwin,

I'm writing to follow-up on my last correspondence to you, but before all of that, let me say I hope you had a nice Thanksgiving Holiday with your family.

Since my last letter dated October 30th 2008, WMEI-TV (TeleMar) has received a formal written confirmation from Liberty Cablevision that TeleMar will be added to its cable system as soon as the hard line connection to its head end is effective. I believe the connections will be made by the end of this month or sooner. As you know, we are seeking the same result from Choice Cable Systems (Choice). Yet despite the fact that TeleMar has a legal right to its carriage by Choice by virtue of its status as a FCC licensed full-power television station serving all of the rated market, TeleMar has done and will continue to do all we can to create a special partnership with Choice. To that end, TeleMar will provide a positive "value added" element to Choice's channel line-up based on our desire to arrive at a working relationship that is of benefit to both Choice and TeleMar.

Therefore, as I previously indicated TeleMar would like to create a special relationship with Choice and with that in mind has offered Choice a new Spanish Language weather exclusive, AccuWeather, plus a new Spanish Language news channel exclusive, Hispanic News Network (HNN). We believe Choice will benefit from including our two new 24 hours a day channels, plus TeleMar on each of your channel lineups. There will be no charge for either of the Spanish Language channels being offered by us and almost all advertising time available will belong to Choice for sale to its clients. What we are asking in exchange for these two sources of programming that will be of value to your subscribers is an immediate commitment to the carriage of TeleMar and to have that carriage on a channel that will approximate our new digital service that will begin Feb 17, 2009.

It is important that you know that we have negotiated the broadcast, as well as, the cable rights for these two significant content channels as part of our plan to offer the weather and news exclusively to the local cable systems. This exclusive content will provide the local cable systems programming which will not be offered to your satellite competitors. TeleMar, Accuweather and Hispanic News Network will be attractive additions as you look for new subscribers.

As noted in my previous correspondence, TeleMar would like to be on Channel 14 which will be our over-the-air channel after the FCC mandated Digital Television Conversion is complete. However, it is imperative to us to be on the Choice system now as we are already offering significant public interest programming on the station. In fact, during much of the day WMEI is broadcasting the same AccuWeather and HNN programming products we are offering to provide to Choice at no charge. As these two stand-alone channels and TeleMar are added to your system we will discontinue almost all of the over the air use of this programming.

Obviously, TeleMar is committed to delivering a signal as defined by FCC rules to your cable head-end at our expense. To insure that we are able to accomplish this, please provide us with a technical contact who we can work with in determining whether an alternative delivery mechanism is necessary, and to coordinate access to your head-end for the installation of any additional equipment that may be necessary for the delivery of a usable signal.

We look forward to your cooperation and we really want to work with you to promote the value of Choice Cable Systems.
