Re: Cable Carriage Request for WMEI-TV, Arecibo, Puerto Rico

Dear Jose,

On October 16, 2006, CMCG Puerto Rico License LLC ("CMCGPR"), licensee of commercial television station WMEI(TV) ("WMEI"), Arecibo, Puerto Rico,<sup>1</sup> sent a letter to [Liberty Cablevision of Puerto Rico, Inc.], pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 76.64(f)(4), electing must-carry status for WMEI (the "Election Letter").<sup>2</sup> The election was made for all communities in the Puerto Rico market in which [Liberty Cablevision of Puerto Rico, Inc.] operates.<sup>3</sup> WMEI is qualified for carriage pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 76.56(b), and is entitled to carriage on [Liberty Cablevision of Puerto Rico, Inc.].<sup>4</sup> Below, please find the required station information:

<sup>1</sup> WMEI initially signed on the air as a new commercial television station on September 17, 2006. The FCC, however, dismissed WMEI's license application and allowed the underlying construction permit to lapse. On October 31, 2006 the FCC reinstated WMEI's construction permit. WMEI subsequently re-initiated over-the-air broadcasting, and CMCGPR filed a new license application for WMEI on November 29, 2006. The FCC granted the license application on August 3, 2007.

<sup>3</sup> Puerto Rico is considered a single television market for must-carry purposes pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 76.55(e). WMEI, therefore, is a local commercial television station, and entitled to must-carry status, on each cable system operating in Puerto Rico.


<sup>4</sup> If the Election Letter is found to be invalid for any reason, WMEI would still be considered a default must-carry station and would still be entitled to must-carry status on [Liberty Cablevision of Puerto Rico, Inc.].
