Section A: Newscast Overview

KXPO Radio produces sixteen local newscasts weekdays. In depth "morning drive" reports air following national news at 6, 7, and 8am. Other reports occur following national news at 10am, 11am, and 12pm, independently at 4:30pm and 5:35pm, and hourly until midnight. KAUJ Radio carries identical news content as KXPO at the top of the hour from 5:00 AM to 8:00 AM weekdays.

News treatments: The length of each of our lead or features stories described below is between thirty-seconds and two minutes-thirty seconds.

News Cycle: Exclusive stories run in each of the daily local newscasts before being archived. As an example: A local story or feature will air eight times in the course of a day, once in each newscast. In addition, these stories are available to our audience ondemand via our station website for one week from date of first broadcast.

Sample: Below is a sample which represents the typical local news stories produced daily by our stations.

April 2015

4/8/15

Reported that the city of Grafton would have a city clean up in 2015. There had been concerns whether or not it would happen as the city's land fill had been closed by the EPA earlier in the year. Grafton, working out a per-ton agreement with independently owned Refuse Disposal Service was able to guarantee that a spring clean up would proceed.

4/16/15

Reported on a series of wildfires that swept through the region. Three major fires had been reported on I-29 which prompted its closure for a number of hours. The fires caused zero visibility on the interstate and were blamed for a multiple car pileup near Manvel.

May 2015

5/1/15

Reported that a Grafton man had been sentenced to serve 2 1/2 years in prison and spend 3 years probation. 62 year old Gregory Sevigny faced six felony charges related to possessing explosives, preventing arrest and terrorizing after an hour long standoff with police that had occurred in November. Sevigny had reached a plea deal on the charges for reduced sentence. Total fines levied against him totaled \$2,200

5/6/15

Reported that Walsh County Commissioners were notified by the City of Grafton that city officials wished to revisit their joint venture agreement concerning the use of the county Law Enforcement Center. The city wishes to pay less of a percentage of the total costs. Commissioners agreed to discuss the idea but believe the cost division between the county and city is fair.

June 2015

6/8/15

Reported that a woman had died when her vehicle had entered the Park River. Police had responded to a call for service regarding a missing person at 4:39 Saturday afternoon. The investigation into the disappearance led investigator to the bank of the river near Western Ave and 2nd St. The Grafton Police with assistance from surrounding agencies retrieved the vehicle from the river around 11:03 PM that evening with the body of Carolina Mendoza inside.

6/11/15

Reported that a total of 119 Grafton School District patrons had turned out that Tuesday evening to vote Scott Leclerc, Jennifer Thompson and Jeff Hermanson to terms on the school board. Voters also overwhelmingly voted to publish school board meeting minutes in the district's official newspaper on a 101-18 vote

Section B: Special and Non-Broadcast Events

Throughout the year, Simmons Stations assist local groups and organizations with the promotion and or co-sponsorship of various activities and events. Our involvement may include contributions of in-kind advertising, cash donations, company staff donating their own time to assist with a given event, etc. Below are some examples which are representative of these efforts.

1. Rod & Reel Rally Registration

Each year, KXPO & KAUJ partner with the Drayton Area Chamber of Commerce and the Red River Resort to generate entries for the regions largest cat fishing tournament. Proceeds benefit the Drayton Area Chamber.

2. First Care Health Center Golf Scramble Fundraiser

Simmons Broadcasting was a hole sponsor at the First Care Health Center Golf Scramble Fundraiser. Proceeds from the event benefit First Care Health Center.

3. Donation to Valley Cruisers Car show

Simmons Broadcasting donated t-shirts to be used as door prizes at the Valley Cruisers Car show that was on the Heritage Village grounds June 27th. Proceeds from that event benefit the Valley Cruisers.

4. \$5,000 worth of marketing donated to Grafton SummerFest Event

1. Memorial Day Program

KXPO broadcast real time audio of the Memorial Day Program organized by Grafton American Legion. The program was located at Marketplace on 8th Ballroom in Grafton. The broadcast is greatly appreciated by veterans and all listeners not able to travel to the event.

2. Grafton Farmers Market

Farmers Market organizer, Heather Szklarski, was interviewed about the growing market to invite people to attend a fundraiser brunch being held to raise money for the farmers market.

3. Grafton Parks and Recreation

Director, Mike Steinfeld, is interviewed weekly about the happenings at all of the various Park and Recreation activities and facilities. Topics frequently include swimming pool availability, swimming lessons, equipment rentals, shelter reservations, and the hiking trails.

4. Grafton Area Chamber of Commerce

The Executive Director of the Grafton Area Chamber of Commerce, Todd Morgan, is interviewed weekly to promote chamber events and news.

5. Walsh County Extension Agent

KXPO airs a weekly report from the Walsh County Extension Agent to share timely issues facing farmers in the region.
