Section A: Newscast Overview

KAUJ FM Radio produces 5 daily newscasts. Five 2 minute 'morning drive' reports air at 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9am.

News Treatments: The nominal length of each of our lead or feature stories described below is between thirty-seconds and two minutes-thirty seconds.

News Cycle: Exclusive stories run in each of the daily local newscasts before being archived. As an example: A local story or feature will air 5 times in the course of a day, once in each newscast. In addition these stories are available to our audience ondemand via our station website for one week from date of first broadcast.

News 1-5-17

City roofing project

The Grafton City's Councils Ways and Means Committee passed a motion Monday to accept the bid from a Grand Forks Company to re-roof City Hall, Fire Station #101 and the Ambulance Building. Tecta America was had the winning bid of Just over \$64,560 for city hall and the fire station and \$23,120 for the Ambulance building. Tecta American beat out Skinner roofing of Grand Forks which submitted a bid of just over \$106,000 for both projects.

News 1-11-17

Grafton Park Board

The Grafton Park District will hold a Facility Committee meeting tonight at the Council Chambers at City Hall at 5:30 p.m. The sole topic of discussion will be the future of the Centennial Center's nearly 30-year old ice plant and ideas on how to continue to operate and eventually replace it. Recently the Park District had to foot a more than a \$10,000 bill when 244 gallons of R22 refrigerant leaked from the facilities ice plant. Dahl said Grafton Parks and Recreation has invited several entities including Midwest Refrigeration, the Grafton School Board, The city of Grafton, the Blue Line Club, the Grafton Youth Hockey Board and the Red River Regional council to tonight's Meeting to discuss plans of dealing with the issue in the future

One vehicle roll over east of Park River

Icy road conditions were partly to blame for a one-vehicle rollover accident Early Tuesday about one mile east of Park River on Highway 17. A late model GMC pickup was traveling east at approximately 7:40 a.m. when the driver of the attempted to pass another vehicle. The driver of the GMC pickup lost control, and rolled in the south ditch according to the Walsh County Sherriff's Department. The driver and the passenger described as two teenage boys were not injured. The Accident happened as the pair was on their way to school in Park River.

News for 3-15-17

Utilities Ordinance

By a 7-1 vote Monday, the Grafton City Council, on recommendation from the Public Utilities Committee passed a first reading changing the City's ordinance regarding utility Service.

The new ordinance changes the Deposit for service from 100 dollars to 250 dollars. The Due date is moved from the first of the month to the 15th of each month. The ordinance changes the disconnect date to 15 days after the bill due date and increases the reconnect fee from \$25 to 30 dollars.

The ordinance also holds the property owner responsible for 50 percent of bills that go to bad debt.

News 3-21-17

Grafton School District Admin restructuring

With all three schools, Century Elementary, Grafton Middle School and Grafton High School under one roof, Grafton School District # 3 has restructured its Administrative positions for the 2017 -2018 school year. At its Regular monthly meeting the Grafton School Board approved the following contracts. Michael Kaiser will be Principal for Grades 7-12, he is currently principal for the Middle School. Randy Rice Assistant HS Principal and Activities Director. Current Century Elementary Principal Jill Olson will be principal for grades Pre-K through second grade and Current second grade teacher Stephanie Nilson has been offered a Grade 3 through Grade 6 principal position.

Superintendent Jack Maus said the restructuring will save the School District about one to two percent in its administrative budget. Current High School principal Darin Albrecht will take over for Maus as Superintendent of Schools on July 1, 2017.

3- iNews.TV







"Most women have a surprisingly deep connection to their favorite radio station," said BURNS. "We asked them who they felt understood them better: the radio station they listen to most, people who decide what fashions to stock in department stores, or the manufacturers of the cosmetics they use. Despite the fact that the cosmetics and fashion industries spend millions of dollars on understanding and predicting women, radio wins (80% to 69% each for fashions and cosmetics)."



Section C: Short/Long Form Programs – Flood Reports

Each spring our stations coverage area is subject to a degree of flooding caused by swollen rivers as well as overland flooding. Some years the impacts are greater than others. Every year residents turn to our trusted radio stations for important flood related news and information. This information takes the form of road closures, river level readings, disaster preparedness, etc. Typical flood reports are broadcast several times each day across all of our radio stations and are also made available for download on our websites. Flood Reports are anchored by our Grafton based News Reporter, Mike Allen, Langdon based News Reporter Ken Morgan and Morden, MB based News Reporter Dusty Van Der Steen.

Grafton-SPECIFIC: Flood updates March 20-March 31.

While area rivers and streams were threatening to flood, 1340 A.M. KXPO and KAUJ FM 100.9 aired flood reports three times daily at 7:45 a.m., 12:05 p.m. and 5:45 p.m. Each report was approximately 2 minutes long. Content included general flood information provided by the national weather service river level observations for all rivers and streams in our broadcast area as well as safety reminders and warning as warranted.
