Section A: Newscast Overview

KAUJ FM Radio produces 5 daily newscasts. Five 2 minute 'morning drive' reports air at 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9am.

News Treatments: The nominal length of each of our lead or feature stories described below is between thirty-seconds and two minutes-thirty seconds.

News Cycle: Exclusive stories run in each of the daily local newscasts before being archived. As an example: A local story or feature will air 5 times in the course of a day, once in each newscast. In addition these stories are available to our audience ondemand via our station website for one week from date of first broadcast.

The attached stories are representative of the local news content we produce on a daily basis:

1/08/16

Reported on the closing of the Grafton Job Service Office. Grafton's office was to be closed along with six other offices across the state. The cuts were the result of a recent budget shortfall and came a month after lawmakers had denied an emergency appropriation of \$240,000 to the agency. Job Service employees from neighboring offices would be visiting Grafton twice a month until l April 30th when the building would officially be closed.

1/12/16

Reported that Grafton Police Chief Anthony Dumas had rescinded his earlier resignation from the Grafton Police Department. Dumas made the announcement at January's City Council meeting. The council unanimously accepted the rescission. Dumas made the decision to stay in Grafton after city officials were able to work out a new pay agreement with him.

2/01/16

Reported on the latest flood outlook from the National Weather Service. Grand Forks meteorologist Greg Gust said the likelihood of flooding in Easter North Dakota for 2016 was extremely low. Soil moisture at freeze up was near normal to below normal and precipitation through the winter was below normal. At the time of the report the snow pack in the region was also normal to below normal.

2/03/16

Reported the Grafton Ways and Means committee had discussed amending a number of city ordinances at its February meeting. Changes would include changing the way fines were issued to violators of the city's snow mobile ordinance. The committee recommended removing language in current ordinance which required violators to pay a \$25 fine and instead move the violations to the general penalty guidelines. The change would allow a municipal judge to levy fines as they deemed fit on a case by case basis.

3/16/16

Reported on a community health needs assessment held at Unity Medical Center in Grafton. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the overall well being of the community in regards to healthcare, recreation, business and more. The meeting was held in conjunction with the Walsh County Health Department, First Care Health Center and the Center for Rural Health and UND.

3/22/16

Reported on the latest round of petition of nomination filings with the city. City Auditor Connie Johnson wished to remind residents wishing to run for office that the deadline to file as a candidate was Monday April 11th at 4:00 p.m. Reminded residents the city/primary election would be held on June 14th.

Section B: Special and Non-Broadcast Events

Throughout the year Simmons Stations assist local groups and organizations with the promotion and or cosponsorship of various activities and events. Our involvement may include contributions of in-kind advertising, cash donations, company staff donating their own time to assist with a given event, etc. Below are some examples which are representative of these efforts.

1- IBIB Scholarship

Each year Simmons Stations in conjunction with SESAC and the International Broadcasters Idea Bank promote a ten thousand dollar scholarship opportunity which is offered to a college student who plans to pursue a career in radio broadcasting or music.

2- Sports Guide

Twice each year (fall & winter) Simmons Multimedia produces The Area Sports Guide. This printed booklet features over 40 pages of area high school team photos, game schedules and features. The guides are made available free to the general public. An online version is also available on our website sports page.

3- Devils Lake Tourism Map

During first quarter Simmons Multimedia released the 2016 Devils Lake Region Area Directory & Map. A total of ten thousand maps were printed and distributed at rest areas and other locations across the state.

4- Client Outreach/Marketing Seminars

Throughout the year, Simmons Stations offer free marketing seminars to area businesses. The focus of these meetings is on attracting and retaining customers using total marketing solutions including radio/TV/print/digital/outdoor. Businesses who participate are under no obligation to purchase advertising from Simmons Stations. KXPO AND KAUJ FM produces a daily 15 minute program called Community Billboard. The program has been running for over 30 years and features interviews with community leaders and local newsmakers. The program airs Monday through Saturday at 9:10 AM and is hosted by News Director Ryan Johnson. A description of some of the program topics covered during the quarter is attached.

Walsh County Extension Agent, Brad Brommund, provides a weekly report helpful to our farming community.

Grafton Parks and Recreation director, Mike Steinfeldt, is an in studio guest weekly to promote awareness about the programs available through the organization and to provide information about their events.

3/3/16 Unity Medical Center 'friends of the foundation' were in studio guests talking about a community health assessment survey being handed out to area residents. They encourage everyone to complete a survey to assist them in assessing and improving the services they provide.

Officer Tony Dumas of the Grafton Police department is an in studio guest monthly to inform the public about timely topics such as new ordinances for snow mobile violations in city limits and the departments yearly report on numbers, miles traveled, number of arrests, etc.
