KAUJ FM Radio produces 5 daily newscasts. Five 2 minute 'morning drive' reports air at 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9am.

News Treatments: The nominal length of each of our lead or feature stories described below is between thirty-seconds and two minutes-thirty seconds.

News Cycle: Exclusive stories run in each of the daily local newscasts before being archived. As an example: A local story or feature will air 5 times in the course of a day, once in each newscast. In addition these stories are available to our audience ondemand via our station website for one week from date of first broadcast.

Nat'l guard to leave armory

The North Dakota National Guard has had a presence in Grafton for more than 70 years, that will change in less than a month. At this week's regular monthly meeting of the Grafton city council's Ways and Means committee the committee reviewed a letter from Adjutant General of the North Dakota National Guard Alan S. Dorman, outlining the Guard's departure. Effective June 30, the guard is exercising the termination clause in the current lease agreement. The Guard will vacate the leased space in the Grafton Armory.

June 19th through 25th is Pollinator Week, to celebrate and bring awareness, Grafton-area Master Gardeners will host a Show and Tell night in the NDSU Extension Master Gardener Certified Pollinator Garden located at the north end of Leistikow Park. The garden contains native perennials strategically chosen to bloom in spring, summer and fall to nourish native pollinators.

Grafton man faces new GSI charges

A Grafton man who was recently acquitted of Gross Sexual Imposition charges faces new GSI charges in Northeast District Court. Anthony Soliz Herrera Jr. was found not guilty of engaging in a sexual act with a 35-year old woman within the city of Grafton. Following the conclusion of the bench trial last week, Walsh County State's Attorney Barb Whelan filed a felony complaint which included two additional charges of Gross sexual imposition alleging Herrera had sexual relations with the 12-year old witness in the first case.

News 7-26-17

Supreme court rules to keep seat in Grafton

By a 4 to 1 ruling, The North Dakota Supreme Court has ordered the state to fill an open judicial seat in Grafton being vacated by Judge Richard Geiger. Geiger plans to step down from the bench October 1st. Governor Burgum will now ask a Judicial Nominating Committee to compile a list of candidates for the position. Justice Daniel Crothers was the lone dissenting vote. He argued in favor of placing the judgeship in Grand Forks and consider moving Walsh County to the Northeast Central Judicial District to help balance resources and need. Justices Gerald Vande Walle, Carol Running Kapsner, Jerord E. Tufte and Lisa Fair McEvers ruled in favor of keeping the Judgeship in Grafton.

In an effort to bring awareness to prescription drug abuse, the second of three drug take back events in Walsh County will be held at Grafton Drug today. The Drug take back events are sponsored by the Walsh County Health Department and local law enforcement. Prescription drug abuse, especially opioid abuse It is a problem that is at epidemic proportions in much of the country. Today's event at Grafton Drug will be held from 10:30am to 1:00pm.

News 8-30-17

Policing in Park River

Keep the status quo, that was the consensus of a meeting held Monday night in Park River in regard to policing within the City. The public was invited to the special meeting of the City council, also present were representatives from the Walsh County Sherriff's Department and members of the Walsh County board of commissioners. The meeting was called after last week's regular bi-monthly meeting of the Walsh County Commissioners, when park river city council member Dwight Byron, representing city, expressed his concerns about the cost of policing in Park River. The City currently reimburses the county for the salary and benefits for the deputies who are stationed there fulltime as well other expenses. According to Walsh County Sherriff Ron Jurgens, his department has been working on drawing up a new contract to reflect changes in the number of deputies stationed in Park River.

Section B: Special and Non-Broadcast Events

Throughout the year Simmons Stations assist local groups and organizations with the promotion and or cosponsorship of various activities and events. Our involvement may include contributions of in-kind advertising, cash donations, company staff donating their own time to assist with a given event, etc. Below are some examples which are representative of these efforts.

1- Teacher Of The Month

Each month during the school year Simmons Multimedia Stations acknowledge a deserving area educator with our Teacher of The Month Award. Nominations come from listeners who submit the name of a local teacher on our websites. The winning teacher receives a commemorative plaque, \$100 in cash and a pizza party for the class. 2- Sports Guide

Each school year Simmons Stations co-promote our High School Sports Book which features schedules and photos of area high school teams. The books are made available free and distributed throughout the local communities. An on-line version can be accessed on our stations websites.

3- Career Co-op

Throughout the school year Simmons Stations partner with Langdon Area High School to provide a job shadow experience for any student with an interest in pursuing a career in radio broadcasting and media.

4- Hurricane Relief

As portions of the Gulf Coast were battered by Hurricanes Harvey and Maria, Simmons Stations promoted Red Cross relief efforts both on air and thru our web/social media pages.

5- Tractor Cruise

Each June Simmons Stations host the Annual Antique Tractor, Car and Pick-Up Cruise. 2017 marked our 10th Anniversary for this event which is well received by participants and spectators alike. The event bolsters area tourism and the local economy.

6- Suicide Prevention (Green Bandana Project)

Suicide is a leading killer of teens and young adults in North Dakota. In August Simmons Stations worked with members of the Green Bandana Project (a local suicide prevention & support group) to promote through our radio stations and web/social media, a 5k Run-Walk event with proceeds donated to the effort.

Section C: Short Form Programs

KXPO AND KAUJ FM produces a daily 15 minute program called Community Billboard. The program has been running for over 30 years and features interviews with community leaders and local newsmakers. The program airs Monday through Saturday at 8:20 AM and is hosted by Sean Ford. A description of some of the program topics covered during the quarter is attached.

Each year during the small grains and row crop harvest Simmons Stations produce several daily Harvest Reports, written and produced by our Farm Director Ken Morgan and utilizing the services of our media partners and the North Dakota State University Extension Service. Topics include harvest and crop conditions, interviews with local producers and custom combiners, harvest weather, etc. The programs air at scheduled times 7 days a week on each of our radio stations beginning in mid August and continue through the end of the Red River Valley Sugar Beet Campaign in mid to late October.
