Make-A-Wish Wednesday is the third Wednesday of the month and the President and CEO of Make-A-Wish North Dakota, Billi Zielinski, does a live interview or arranges an interview about the program. January 17th a father of a wish recipient was interviewed about the experience and impact the program has had with his son and family. February 21st, Billi Jo Zielinski was our guest to speak about how anyone can donate their airline miles to be used for wish fulfillment and on March 21st she returned to encourage listeners to volunteer with the organization's work.

Thursday, February 22nd, Molly Zahradka was a studio guest. Ms. Zahradka is a local agriculture educator and organizer of the local Future Farmers of America chapter and her interview was to provide information about National FFA week and what her students were doing to celebrate & volunteer.

Every Monday, Shirley Burns, the Executive Director of the Grafton Area Chamber of Commerce is live in the studio to speak about events happening locally. She provides dates of upcoming events and gives insight about how the listeners can participate. During first quarter, she also is promoting the annual membership drive for the Chamber of Commerce.

Every Tuesday, Mike Steinfeld with Grafton Parks and Recreation was live in the studio to promote that organization's events and opportunities. During first quarter, Mr. Steinfeld gave information on the figure skating program, ice skating rink schedules and availability, snow trail information, upcoming spring events and other recreational opportunities in the Grafton area.

February 8, 2018 was Giving Hearts Day. It is a day where organizations who qualify can receive matching funds to every dollar donated and we had several eligible organizations in our listening area. Unity Medical Center was one of them, and Kristi Jelinek from the UMC Foundation was a studio guest on both February 1st and February 8th to encourage listeners to make a donation to the hospital on Giving Hearts Day. Stacey Maurstad from CHI Friendship, Inc. was a studio guest on February 2nd to solicit Giving Hearts Day donations for that organization.

March into Spring Contest



Section – C – Newscast Overview

KAUJ FM Radio produces 5 daily newscasts. Five 2 minute 'morning drive' reports air at 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9am.

News Treatments: The nominal length of each of our lead or feature stories described below is between thirty-seconds and two minutes-thirty seconds.

News Cycle: Exclusive stories run in each of the daily local newscasts before being archived. As an example: A local story or feature will air 5 times in the course of a day, once in each newscast. In addition these stories are available to our audience on-demand via our station website for one week from date of first broadcast.

News 1-15-18

Gaming at 12th Street Bowl

Charitable gaming will be returning to 12th Street Bowl in Grafton. At its regular monthly meeting Monday, the Grafton City Council approved a motion to allow a gaming site run by The Park River Volunteer Fire Department. Both black jack and pull tabs will be offered at the 12th Street Bowl located on Highway 17. The Grafton Volunteer fire Department sold pull tabs at the establishment until mid summer 2017 until that contract was terminated. The Park River Volunteer Fire department says they will help sponsor youth bowling in Grafton with some of the gaming proceeds.

Park River woman arrested for assault

A Park River woman is facing a Class C Felony Charge of Aggravated Domestic Assault from an incident which allegedly occurred on January 16th in Park River.

According to court documents, Alicia Van Dyk, 22 of Park River, slashed her boyfriend's knee with a utility knife. The unidentified male victim also alleges that Van Dyk also choked him until he nearly lost consciousness. Van Dyk was arrested after an unrelated traffic stop in Grand Forks County on Jan. 26.

Grafton City Council reviews Armory plans

At Monday's regular monthly meeting, Grafton's city council heard from Bobbi Hepper Olson of Hepper Olson Architects about proposed plans and costs for renovation of the Grafton Armory to transform it into a multi-use community Center. All told, the probable costs that were presented could total as much as \$1.6 million dollars. Mayor Chris West said the City Council has no immediate plans to go ahead with any phases of the project at this time and discussion on the project was tabled for a later date.

Grafton Park Board - Pumpkin Patch

Grafton and surrounding residents will soon have a new fall activity to look forward to. At this week's regular monthly meeting of the Grafton Park Board, director Bill Dahl informed the board of the Park District's intentions to plant a corn maze and pumpkin patch on Parks and Rec Property this spring. The intention is to incorporate both features into an ongoing fall festival type of event which will be held for several weekends this fall.

News 3-13-18

Grafton Flood protection

The City of Grafton continues working on plans for its Flood Risk Reduction Project. At Monday's meeting the City Council approved an amendment to the Engineer-Owner Agreement. The Amendment adds another \$ 3.9 Million to the project cost. City Nick Ziegelmann says the increase is for expected construction and engineering costs. Contractors hope to start work on the project in mid to late April.

News 3-16-18

Centennial Center Lobby construction

Grafton Parks and Recreation Director Bill Dahl said the Centennial Center Lobby construction project is all but complete, although the official deadline for completion was November, 2017. Dahl said gutters need to be installed on the building's canopy along with a few other small finishing touches. Dahl said there were overages for the project totaling just under \$15,000. He said the Park District has agreed to pay for approximately \$3,000 in overages with the Grafton Blue Line Club paying the balance.
