NEWS COVERAGE

During the second quarter KTFS-AM aired a total of 65 newscasts covering stories of local importance. Within these newscasts, 63 stories dealt with crime; 24 stories dealt with education; 16 were coverage of business and/or the economy; 14 stories focused on political topics; 13 focused on family-related issues; 12 addressed events of local interest; 10 stories were about the environment and 9 were on health-related topics. KTFS-AM broadcasts local news at 6:30, 7:30 and 8:30AM weekdays.
