THURSDAY, MARCH 30<sup>TH</sup> 2017: 7:00 AM MILLER COUNTY ARKANSAS JUDGE ROY JOHN MCNATT DISCUSSED EFFORTS TO REBUILD THE BRIDGE OFF HIGHWAY 67 ON COUNTY ROAD 64 LEADING TO THE TYSON ANIMAL FOOD PROCESSING PLANT. THE BRIDGE COLLAPSED A WEEK EARLIER WITH A PICK UP TRUCK TRYING TO CROSS. MCNATT SAYS HE EXPECTED BRIDGE REPAIRS TO COST AROUND 250,000 THOUSAND DOLLARS AND WILL TAKE AROUND A MONTH TO FULLY REPAIR. A TEMPORARY BRIDGE IS CURRENTLY CARRYING TRAFFIC OVER THE DITCH AND TO THE TYSON PLANT. DOZENS OF FEED TRUCKS USE THE CROSS EACH DAY.
