A segment of our daily morning call-in show featured a discussion with WWCC employees Dustin Conover, Rick Reynolds & Art Castillo and those from the WWCC Learning Center with regard to the “Dads Making a Difference” program and how single fathers in Southwest Wyoming can take advantage of the program to receive a CDL and provide a better life for their children with a more stable occupation.
