Monday: The issue on this broadcast was an effort to stop voter fraud in Connecticut through an organization called, "fight voter fraud" which is a website. Linda Szykowitz is the head of the organization which seeks to ferret out fraud in voting patterns in Connecticut. Anissa Porticelli hosted the program.

Tuesday: The issue on this broadcast, one of two was about the efforts of teachers who disagree with the American Federation of Teachers, to leave the union while protecting their rights under contract. John Grande spoke with Carol Platt Liebau from the Yankee Institute.

Wednesday: The issue on this broadcast was a conversation with Steve Brown, the host of Key Life, a program aired on the station. Brown is scheduled to be the guest speaker at a station annual event for listeners. Brown spoke of his program preparation, audience and satisfaction with his work. The host was Steve Tuzeneu.

Thursday: The issue on this broadcast was presenting the second of two programs about teachers in Connecticut, and the effort of some to leave their bargaining unit, the American Federation of Teachers. Teacher John Grande was again interviewed by Carol Platt Liebau, head of the Yankee Institute in Hartford, a conservative think tank.

Friday: The issue on this broadcast was a lawsuit filed by a number state attorneys general including William Tong of Connecticut on the grounds that the operation of Amazon.com is anti-competitive. The broadcast consisted of excerpts from his news conference announcing that his office was joining with other states to file suit to settle the matter. Paul Kretschmer hosted.

Saturday: The issue on this broadcast was introducing Christian music performer Sylvia Jones to listeners in Connecticut. Jones has been performing for some time but would like to be better recognized in Connecticut. Her career and recordings were discussed with host Gerry Williams.
