When compared to the private sector, teachers in public schools and universities are paid higher sums than those in the private sector. Teacher pension obligations are considerably higher than the funding that has been set aside. Governor Dannel Malloy now wants to shift some of that obligation to the towns and cities of Connecticut. In fact, Governor Malloy wants the cities and towns to pick up as much as one-third of the obligation. That shift would require most municipal governments to raise property taxes, with the money going to past teachers, rather than current teachers and their students in school at the present time.
