Ms. Reid, will discuss the cause, transmission, prevention and treatment of Lyme disease. Lyme disease is a tick-borne illness, which can cause fever, headache, fatigue, and, often times, a characteristic skin rash. If left untreated, infection can spread to joints, the heart and nervous system. Most cases of Lyme disease can be treated successfully with a course of antibiotics. Using tick repellent, removing ticks properly and reducing tick habitat can help prevent the spread of Lyme disease.
