**Tuesday:** The issue on this broadcast was an introduction to listeners of the Connecticut River Museum along the shoreline in Essex, Connecticut. Elizabeth Kaeser was the guest, director of the museum who described it for listeners in a conversation with host Gerry Williams. The museum has unique exhibits found nowhere else.

**Wednesday:** The issue on this broadcast was a situation now being corrected that allowed motor vehicle owners from just about anywhere including Connecticut, to obtain auto registrations from the Department of Motor Vehicles in Vermont. From the Yankee Institute in Hartford, Meghan Portfolio explained the loopholes that allowed this situation to exist and how abuses have now persuaded Vermont to shut down the loophole that allowed this to happen. **Thursday & Friday:** The issue on these two broadcasts discussed was anxiety in adults and how to tackle it, eliminate triggers causing anxiety so adults can function normally. The Reverend Jeff Peabody faced his own challenges and found relief through trying by process of trial and error how to obtain relief. Paul Kretschmer was the host.

**Saturday:** The issue on this broadcast was the existence of so many working people in Connecticut as well as the rest of the country who find it almost impossible to earn the income needed for basic necessities, whether for themselves only or supporting a household of two or more including families with children.
