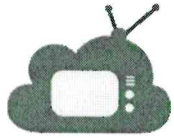

Mesick earned a Purple Heart while serving in the U.S. Army as a gunner during combat in Iraq.

Mesick later transitioned while a major federal gun prosecution was underway in Vermont

Burlington City Councilors will consider a resolution condemning what they call transphobia.

Progressive Councilor Joe Magee has been working on a resolution that is slated to go before Burlington City Council this evening.

(031323SOT Joe Magee)

The resolution calls out a series of what is deemed 'hateful actions' against Vermont's L-G-B-T-Q-I-A community, including vandalism at the Pride Center and transphobic stickers placed around the community and in schools.

The resolution claims that 378 anti-LGBTQ bills in legislatures across the country have only encouraged hateful acts against the queer and transgender community, even here in Vermont.

The resolution also makes several commitments including: -tracking transphobic and other hate speech. -asking Burlington's state delegation to look into the current state hate crime statute. -work in coordination with the Burlington Police Department to examine the city's graffiti ordinance.

Community members will have an opportunity to discuss the resolution at the city council meeting tonight. Public comment starts at 7:30pm

Once the ballots are tallied on Town Meeting Day next week, Winooski is set to have all of its city councilors be openly LGBTQ+. It would be a historic first for the state.

The Winooski City Council already has three LGBTQ+ members. Two are not up for reelection this year -- Thomas Renner, who is gay, and Aurora Hurd, who is bisexual, nonbinary and transgender. Incumbent councilor Bryn Oakleaf, who is queer, is up for reelection, ~~though she~~ ^{and} does not face any challengers.

The City Council also has an open seat this year, with incumbent Jim Duncan opting to not seek reelection. Charles Judge, who is transgender, is running for that seat uncontested.
