Today, CHS is one of the largest social services organizations in Stockton, and the only licensed Short-Term Residential Therapeutic Program STRTP in San Joaquin County, that has been serving at-risk youth in San Joaquin County and throughout California for 140 years. CHS also offers an on-campus one. Vision alternative education program for our residential students which is operated through the San Joaquin County Office of Education. Each year, the Children's Home of Stockton provides youth with comprehensive educational and therapeutic services. Our goal is to create an environment that mentors' civility, expects responsibility, and promotes kindness.
