The above program is locally produced and presenting a mix of local news in Tulsa, and Oklahoma City as well as national news. The Program also consist live phone calls from local listeners.

1. Daily Newscast: Local (Tulsa & Oklahoma City) and nation daily newscast 10 minutes
2. Social Issues: Covered social issues and needs.
3. Politics: Covering local, state, and national politics.
4. Public Safety: Covered issues related to police, and crime.
5. Education: Covered issues related to education
6. Health: Provided information concerning health issues in the community.
7. Phone Calls: Conversations with local listeners about daily issues they're dealing with.

July 2022

It is our endeavor to serve the public interest. Here at KGTO Heart and Soul 99.1 FM & 1050 AM, we continuously broadcast issues of concern to Tulsa and its listening public. The following is a brief description of these issues that were addressed during the 3rd quarter. We are airing PSA's informing the listeners up to date on various health concerns such as: Foster Care, Ways to Quit Smoking, Ovarian Cancer Screenings, Prostrate Cancer Screening as well as Free Health Screenings in the metro. Here are some of the people and organization we interviewed. In July we interviewed Marlon Ladd with the Oklahoma City and Tulsa film industry. He also wanted to find local actors for a current film project he was working on, Black Wall Street. We also talked to Arif Abdullah about natural medicines and natural health for the body. We spoke to Mrs. June Elkins Baker and Dr. Scott Martin about Leadership Learning Academy and scholarship that were available. We talked to Hansen Darni and Dante Williams with the Tulsa Black Wall Street Chamber of Commerce. On July 8th we talked to Rep. Regina Goodwin from Tulsa, OK. We talked about the tribute and passing of Sherry Gamble Smith, Executive Director with the Tulsa Black Wall Street Chamber. Mike Reed and the Tulsa Juneteenth car license plates where the proceeds go to Tulsa Juneteenth and part to Teacher Class Room Supplies Fund. We also talked about the Oklahoma Baptist State Convention Prison Ministry 16th Annual Program. We spoke with Hansen Larry with Oak Street Health about the services they provide such as: Quality Primary Care, helping you in navigating your health insurance as well as their 24/7 patients support line.

August 2022

We continue to broadcast daily and weekly briefings in Tulsa on what to expect in the 2022-2023 school year. Ashley Ehrhart, current Miss Oklahoma USA came in and talked about her platform, mental health awareness. Dr. Launa Turna-Addison with the Tulsa Technology Center talked about the NTEDI’s 18th Annual Back To School Event and school supplies and resources for teachers. We talked to Rep. Regina Goodwin of Tulsa about HB 1775, Gov Kevin Stitt and the Tulsa school system. Sharron Jackson Glover with the Metro Technology Center talked about serving high school students and being a business coach. Jabar Shumate with the Urban League talked about getting out to vote and free rides to the polls. Rep. Jason Lowe came in and talked about lower voter turn out for the current elections

We continue to broadcast daily and weekly briefings in Tulsa first with our Representative Regina Goodwin discussing various topics including: School board Redistricting Tulsa Public School, having another special session at the end of September regarding ARPA funds (American Rescue Plan Act. Donna Jackson with Greenwood Women's Business informed us on how they assist female entrepreneurs. They provide services such as: training, mentorship, and guiding women on how to start their own business. Jerimiah and Velvet (Sickle Cell Walk) also shared information on what sickle cell is and what are the traits in the black community. Senator Anastasia Pittman came in to talk about the importance of getting out to vote. Donna Jackson call in and talked about the Greenwood Women's Business Center. Hanson Dirani and Starr Fisher called in and talked about the Greenwood Black Chamber and what they have to offer. Theo Noel with Guiding Right and Dr. Marshan Merrick talked about having a health fair for senior citizen.
