- 3. Politics: Covering local, state, and national politics.
- 4. Public Safety: Covered issues related to police, and crime.
- 5. Education: Covered issues related to education
- 6. Health: Provided information concerning health issues in the community.
- 7. Phone Calls: Conversations with local listeners about daily issues they're dealing with.

## **July 2023**

It is our endeavor to serve the public interest. Here at KGTO Heart and Soul 1050 AM & 99.1 FM, we continuously broadcast issues of concern to Tulsa and its listening public. The following is a brief description of these issues that were addressed during this 3rd quarter. We are airing PSA's informing the listeners up to date on various health concerns such as: Disability Pride Month, Mental Health Awareness, as well as Free Health Screenings and Free Food Giveaways.

We continue to broadcast daily and weekly briefings in Tulsa with information and services that will educate our listeners. Robin Khouri with (Light Christian Academy) explains how the school is beneficial to children that have loved ones that are incarcerated as well as giving them a top-quality education through a Christian based curriculum. Sherri Coleman and Alyson Parker with the Infant Crisis Center shared the variety of services they offer such as: one week supply of diapers as well as formula. These services as well as others are available four times annually to children from birth to age 3. County Commissioner Carrie Blumert touched on the potential new location for the Oklahoma County Jail sites that has now been narrowed to three sites. Representative Ajay Pittman came on and talked about the State Capital and issues the listeners should be aware of. Donna Thompson talked about the 17th Annual Awareness Program in the state prisons.

## August 2023

We continue to broadcast daily and weekly briefings on the upcoming events. Marilyn Hildreth with the Freedom Festival, talked about Clara Luper being honored during the Oklahoma Freedom Fiesta celebrating 65<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Oklahoma Sit in. Senator James Lankford discussed how he calls for immediate improvements to immigration as well as speaking on the solutions he proposes to President Biden on open borders. The Senator also talked about the 3<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of the signing of the Abraham Accords with Israel, the prevention of government shutdown, and the National Guard & operation Lone Star. Wyndell Barnes with Journey 2 Win LLC talked about helping kids. John Bilbury, treasurer, and Vickie reporting secretary talked about Trice Hill Cemetery. Pastor Manning (T.A.S.K) is an outreach Ministry that helps at risk kids and young adults build better relationships in their community as well as with law enforcement by engaging in conversation on a positive note in hopes of building respective relationships.
