The following is a list of programs which WKLR-FM, Richmond, Virginia, aired from 01 July through 30 September 2019. These programs addressed issues that were determined to be of significant concern to the Richmond, Virginia community during the third guarter of 2019

Local News Stories - WKLR-FM has locally-produced newscasts weekday mornings between 5:00 and 9:00. These newscasts are approximately 3 minutes and cover pertinent topics for the day ranging from local schools and weather to national politics and health concerns.

Focus Richmond (six hours per quarter) – a twenty-five-minute talk show hosted by Local Midday Show Host from K95, Lori Kelly, and airing Sunday mornings at 0630. The program focuses on local public affairs and community issues.

Viewpoints (six hours per quarter) – a thirty-minute issues program produced by Mediatracks airing Sunday mornings at 0600.

Public Service Announcements – announcements provided by not-for-profit groups, local charities, and the Ad Council aired at various times on all days of the week.

Quarterly Issues and Programs List General Issues

The following is a sampling of our coverage of significant issues to which WKLR-FM, Richmond, Virginia, responded from 01 July through 30 September 2019, along with the most pertinent treatments of those issues.

A. Children

Focus Richmond Synopsis of topic reported 8/11

VCU Alumni event organizer, Timmy Nguyen, joins us to talk about the second annual Utlimate Backpack supply drive, presented by CoStar Group. The drive provides students with free, new backpacks filled with school supplies to support schools, neighborhood resource centers, and non profits. The goal is to provide more than 15 thousand children in the Richmond area with backpacks filled with grade-appropriate school supplies. Total news segment time 13 minutes.

Focus Richmond Synopsis of topic reported 8/18

Scott Bennett from SwimRVA joins us to talk about how they are making aquatics accessible. SwimRVA is the non-profit community hub for aquatics in the Richmond region. SwimRVA began as the Greater Richmond Aquatics Partnership (GRAP), a collaboration of five educational and youth sport leaders who shared the goal of providing a world-class aquatics facility in Chesterfield. Today – thanks to everdeveloping and evolving partnerships with civic leaders, schools, community groups, and amazing organizations like the YMCA, the Salvation Army Boys & Girls Clubs, and VCU – they're building social bridges through aquatics that cross physical, racial, and economic barriers. Much more than just a pool, they serve as a catalyst for water

safety, health and fitness, sports tourism, competitive aquatics, and possibility, for all Richmonders. Total news segment time 13 minutes.

Focus Richmond Synopsis of topic reported 9/22

Operation Kidsafe founder Mark Bott joins us to talk about the program. Operation Kidsafe is a free child safety event happening all-across the US. Parents take home the only record of their visit (a bio document) that is ready to hand to law enforcement in an emergency. Safety tips to start a family safety action plan are also included. Total news segment time 13 minutes.

Viewpoints Synopsis of topic reported 7/21

Author Jared Yates Sexton shares memories from his own turbulent accounts as a journalist and connects it to the larger discussion around the phenomenon of toxic masculinity in the U.S. What exactly is toxic masculinity and how is it affecting men and youth? Total news segment time 12 minutes

Viewpoints Synopsis of topic reported 8/11

Parenting in the online era can be quite confusing. At what age should you let your kid have a Facebook or Snapchat account? How closely should you monitor what they view on the internet? We speak with Julianna Miner, author of Raising a Screen Smart Kid: Embrace the Good and Avoid the Bad in the Digital Age, to get the inside scoop on teaching kids how to responsibly navigate the digital world. Viewpoints Synopsis of topic reported 9/1

While schools have put in place comprehensive anti-bullying campaigns, we seldom focus on ensuring the child bully gets the help they need to succeed. We still punish troubled kids with detentions, suspensions and from there it escalates onward. Many seem to never get the proper help and get stuck in a perpetual cycle of trouble throughout life. Focus Richmond Synopsis of topic reported 7/28

Red Door Ministry joins us to discuss how they care for the whole person in mind, body and spirit to the best of their ability. Through well balanced meals, clothes, social work coordination and healing services by their clergy, they've been helping serve the hungry, homeless, food and housing insecure community of Richmond since the early 1980s. Started by the women of the congregation as a Soup Kitchen, in recent years they have expanded to a ministry of Healing, Hospitality and Wholeness. Total news segment time 13 minutes.

Focus Richmond Synopsis of topic reported 8/25

Since 2009, Feel The Love (formerly known as Heat U.P.) has been a key program for Lennox Residential to give back to its communities. Culminating in Feel The Love Day every October, Lennox partners with HVAC installers and local community members in the United States and portions of Canada to deliver units at no cost to people who consistently put others before themselves and need a helping hand. They are collecting nominations now for a deserving family in the Richmond metro area. Total news segment time 13 minutes.

Focus Richmond Synopsis of topic reported 9/15

The VCU Alumni Richmond Chapter is organizing and competing in the Alumni Charity Challenge. Alumni groups from around the country compete to see which school can donate the most canned goods to Feed More, the Central Virginia Food Bank. The event aims to collect over 50

thousand pounds of food in just 3 hours later this week. Total news segment time 13 minutes.

Viewpoints Synopsis of topic reported 8/18

It's estimated that worldwide there are currently between 20 and 40 million people who are exploited through forced labor, marriage and prostitution, according to the International Labor Organization. We take a look at the South Asian country of Nepal where as many as 20,000 girls each year fall victim to human trafficking. We discuss solutions and what more needs to be done to end this global human rights crisis. Total news segment time 11 minutes

C. Veterans and First Responders

Focus Richmond Synopsis of topic reported 7/7

Allen & Allen joins us to talk about their Hometown Heroes initiative. For the past 10 years, they've celebrated acts of local heroism in our community. This year, they'll also be holding a Heroes' Reunion to celebrate the 10 year anniversary. They are joining us to talk about this year's winners. Total news segment time 13 minutes.

These platforms have fewer consumer protections than other forms of payment.
