Local News Stories WKLR-FM has a locally-produced newscast at the top and bottom of the hour each weekday morning between 6:00 and 9:00.

Focus Richmond (five hours per quarter) – a twenty-five-minute talk show hosted by Local Morning Show Host from Star 100.9, Bill Bevins, and airing Sunday mornings at 0630. The program focuses on local public affairs and community issues.
