The Police Athletic League (P.A.L.) started in Jacksonville in 1974 in an effort to give children a safe place to attend afterschool to play sports, work on homework or seek advice from mentors. Their motto is, "filling playgrounds, not prisons." Jordan Ferrell shows us the benefits this program offers to children and introduces us to an officer who has been with the P.A.L. for 20 years.
