Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. Education. According to the Buffalo News and its sources, the Buffalo Public School graduation rate is up from 78.5% to 79%, still below the national average of 87%. This quarter had a big focus on Education and the programs available to help students as well as teachers leading into summer and the next school year.
- B. **Crime.** Buffalo more than doubles the national average in Violent Crimes and Property Crime in 2023 according to bestplaces.net. The programs this month focused on organizations like "To Our Legacys and Legends" and the PAL organization to help those have been affected by crime and also help educate youth in the hopes of that number dropping in the future.
- C. **Nutrition.** According to nih.gov, since Covid, snacking rate has increased while fast food and ordered food consumption has decreased. This shows that consumers are shopping more and consuming the food they have at home rather than dining elsewhere. However, are they eating the right foods? Feed More WNY and Patti Green focus this quarter on healthy eating habits and where to go if you need help with food education or where to get healthy, nutritious food.
- D. **Community.** This May marked one year of the mass shooting that happened right here in Buffalo. Melissa Archer from the Buffalo Urban League and Rev. Mark Blue from the NACCP discussed how that event impacted this community and well as resources to help those that are struggling.
- E. **Tourism.** Niagara Falls is right in Buffalo's back yard and is a big generator of revenue for many local businesses with how many tourists come through that area year after year. Unfortunately, Niagara Falls is also an area that could use some renovations and beautifying. Multiple programs this quarter focused on how Niagara Falls is working towards renovating.
