She says at this time there are more than 100 Covid-19 tests pending and she says the situation will not get better if the community does not listen to warnings. Elder says currently one of the department's main goals is getting more personal protective equipment for healthcare workers and first responders.

They say the IRS will never contact you asking for personal information. You will never have to click links to get your stimulus money. Avoid scammers who say they'll set up a direct deposit account for you. ISP says you'll never need to verify your check amount to anyone, and you'll never be threatened.

The virus has not stopped them from working to meet the community's needs. For those interested in helping these organizations officials say monetary donations are appreciated.
38.1	Elderly Issues and Programs	5:00pm	04/20/20	2:23	WAWV Live at Five	An order signed by Indiana's State Health Commissioner is aiming to protect those most at risk during the pandemic. It comes as data shows about a fourth of Indiana's Covid-19 related deaths happened at nursing homes and long-term care facilities. Indiana officials are allowing some residents at these facilities to be moved. The Indiana state health commissioner recently signed an order allowing long-term care facilities to transport residents during the pandemic. Dr. Box says for a facility to only host Covid-19 patients the decision must be made with input from local hospitals, health officials, public officials and the Indiana State Department of Health.

Today fencing was put up on the north parking lot at the Hilton Garden Inn. This is the first process of the project. Tomorrow's construction will start cutting into the parking lot and installing utilities. Vigo County Mayor, Duke Bennett, also says plans for the Vigo County Capital Improvement Board to purchase the school administration property on Wabash will be finalized next week. That property would be used for additional parking.

The summer feeding program starts June 1 <sup>st</sup> . Students or parents can go to North or South High Schools or West Vigo Elementary from 11 AM to noon for grab and go meals. Meals will be available Monday, Wednesday and Friday with Monday and Wednesday as double serving days. The state of Indiana will give further instructions in mid-July on how the fall school season will proceed.

Illinois' next phase of re-opening is planned for next Friday. Horizon Health officials say they're prepared if the county does see cases. In a recent letter to the governor, county officials included that the hospital has 300 tests, as well as ICU beds and ventilators ready. Horizon Health says they have a dedicated unit with eight beds for Covid-19 patients as well as personal protective equipment. The hospital also has agreements with other area hospitals in case they would need more support. Nasal swab testing is available at horizon health's respiratory clinic.

The winner will receive \$10,000 and a chance to win a million. The event raises money for the food and shelter services that Catholic Charities provides. Starting June 1 <sup>st</sup> people can participate in "Where's Waddles?" Rubber ducks will be hidden throughout the community and those who find them can win prizes. If you want to adopt a duck you can do so online, or at the Catholic Charities Office.

Governor Holcomb announced that we will move into stage four of his "Back on Track Plan." Midnight Friday Entertainment and tourism sites may reopen at 50% capacity. Retail stores and malls may operate at 100% capacity. Restaurants will be allowed to move to 75% capacity. Stage four will also include the reopening of playgrounds, casinos and amusement and water parks, with guidelines.

This includes a 183 million dollar increase for K through 12 funding. As the pandemic impacted the state there were concerns that funding for schools could take a hit. The 183-million-dollar increase will move forward in the fiscal year that starts on July 1st. Holcomb also says over 200 million dollars from the federal cares act will go directly to K through 12. In addition to that funding, 61 million dollars from the governor's emergency fund will be used to help schools with devices and training to prepare for the "new normal."

The program uses 25 million dollars from the Federal Cares Act. The program will aid of up to \$500 per month for four months. This is for households unable to pay all or part of their rent due to a Covid-19 job loss or reduction in income. Assistance will be available in 91 Indiana counties, excluding Marion County. Officials expect the new program to help around 12-thousand households. Officials also say the program is not designed to fully cover all expenses. Officials also say the program does require a landlord's agreement to participate. Applications will open on July 13 <sup>th</sup> . We have details on where you can apply on our website.
