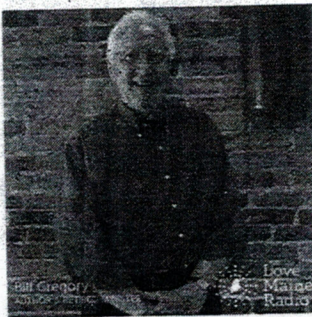

Carol Noonan is an American folk singer/songwriter. She and her husband, Jeff Flagg, a commercial fishing net builder, run the Stone Mountain Arts Center, a music hall behind their house in Brownfield, Maine. She began her career as the lead singer and guitarist of the band Knots and Crosses, which was formed in the late 1980s by Carol Noonan (vocals, guitar), Alan Williams (keyboards, vocals), and Rick Harris (guitar, vocals) who all were students at the New England Conservatory of Music at one time. They built a significant following around Boston and the New England area. After a major-label bidding war led to a failed deal with Island Records, the group disbanded. Carol went on to do three solo albums for the Philo/Rounder label through 1997. The Carol Noonan Band featured Duke Levine and Kevin Barry on guitars. They have stayed with her for most of her live performances over the years, as well as all her albums. Since her time with Rounder she has released a number of albums on her own label carolnoonanmusic.com. An NPR darling for her music, she has also been a guest essayist on Weekend Edition and been included on one of the station's Driveway Moments compilations.

Steve Corry, co-owner of 555, Petite Jacqueline, and Portland Patisserie, began his culinary career as a brewmaster at several breweries in northern California. In 1999 he decided to make a career change and attended the New England Culinary Institute in Vermont, where he graduated with distinction in 2001. He then returned to California to work at the fine dining landmark, Domaine Chandon in Napa Valley. Since the inception of 555, which he opened in 2003 in Portland with his wife, Michelle, Steve has received several accolades, such as *Food and Wine's* Best New Chef in 2007 and Maine's Chef of the Year in 2011. In March 2011, Steve and Michelle opened Petite Jacqueline, a more casual French bistro named after Michelle's grandmother. In Petite's first year they were nominated for a James Beard Award for "Best New Restaurant" in America. Last year the Corry's opened Portland Patisserie in Downtown Portland. When not cooking on the line Steve can be found enjoying his two young sons and fishing. Steve has run the Beach to Beacon 10K for the last three years and ran his first marathon in April in Paris.

Danielle Conway, dean and professor of law at the University of Maine School of Law, joined the law school in July 2015. She is nationally known as a leading expert in public procurement law, entrepreneurship, and as an advocate for minorities and people. Dean Conway teaches in the areas of intellectual property law, licensing intellectual property, international intellectual property law, internet law and policy, and government contract law. Dean Conway has authored numerous books, book chapters, and articles. Her most recent books include *Transnational Intellectual Property Law* (with Nguyen and Mtima), *Licensing Intellectual Property: Theory and Application* (with Nguyen and Gomulkiewicz), and *Intellectual Property, Software, and Information Licensing: Law and Practice* (with Nguyen and Gomulkiewicz). Dean Conway has also delivered numerous speeches since joining Maine Law, predominantly focusing on two themes: first, the role of a public law school in the larger community and, second, the imperative to recapture the narrative of the lawyer and the legal profession. She also has over 25 years of active and reserve service with the U.S. Army and was sworn in to the Maine Army National Guard in 2015. She currently serves as lieutenant colonel.

Roger Berle has long been a resident of Cliff Island with an additional home in Falmouth. Born in Massachusetts in 1943, he first came to Cliff Island when he was six months old and moved to Maine year-round almost 50 years ago. A graduate of Bowdoin University (M.B.A.), he inherited and embraced his parents' major commitments to leadership in conservation and community. He has been heavily involved in nonprofits over the past few decades, even as he managed his construction business on Cliff Island through 2005. But he says it has been important to him to remain on and, often, head organizations dedicated to islands and conservation. Among these are: the Maine Islands Coalition, Sustainable Cliff Island, Cliff Island Corporation for Athletics, Conservation, and Education; Friends of Fort Gorges; Maine Conservation Voters; Oceanside Conservation Trust of Casco Bay; Southern Maine Conservation Collaborative; Portland Trails; and Portland Land Bank Commission.

The ski/skate program is more than 50 years old and allows students to rent ski equipment or skates, and receive instruction from ski/skate personnel. Bruce first started teaching skiing and coaching at Sugarloaf in 1968, after graduating from South Portland high school.
