Harold Pachios is one of the founding partners of law firm Preti Flaherty. Prior to practicing law, he had a career in government and politics. He assisted Sargent Shriver, brother-in-law of President John F. Kennedy, in the early days of the Peace Corps, and worked under President Lyndon B. Johnson as associate White House press secretary. In 1993 he was nominated by President Bill Clinton to be member of the United States Commission on Public Diplomacy. He was confirmed by the U.S. Senate and served for several years as chairman of the commission, traveling to U.S. diplomatic posts throughout the world. He was later appointed by Secretary of State Colin Powell to serve on the State Department's Special Advisory Group on the Arab and Muslim World. He is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations. He was president of the Portland Symphony Orchestra and vice chairman of the board of the American Symphony Orchestra League. He has served on the boards of several educational institutions, including the American College of Greece and the Salzburg Seminar in Salzburg, Austria. He served for nine years on the National Governing Board of Common Cause. For four years he was the Democratic State Chairman in Maine. He is a graduate of Princeton University and Georgetown University Law School.



We humans have been plagued by disease—both infectious and environmental—since we began life on this planet. Today we discuss two very different diseases with individuals who are working to mitigate them. Scientists Dr. Elissa Chesler and Dr. Vivek Kumar (<http://themainemag.com/radio/radio-guests/dr-elissa-chesler-dr-vivek-kumar/>) are studying addiction at the Jackson Laboratory in Bar Harbor. Dr. Elissa Chesler and Dr. Vivek

Dr. Elissa Chesler is an associate professor at the Jackson Laboratory (<https://www.jax.org>) and an interdisciplinary scientist who studies disease complexity in behavioral science, with a specific emphasis on the genetic and genomic analysis of alcohol and substance use disorders. She received a B.S. from the University of Connecticut (<http://uconn.edu>) and a PhD from the University of Illinois (<http://illinois.edu>) at Urbana-Champaign, where she applied data mining algorithms to the study of the influence of the laboratory environment on genetic studies of behavior, an important aspect of research reproducibility. She then performed one of the first studies of gene-expression genetics and designed many of the features of the widely used systems genetics platform, GeneNetwork.org (<http://genenetwork.org/webqtl/main.py>) as a post doc. Dr. Chesler served as the group leader for Mammalian Genetics at Oak Ridge National Laboratory (<https://www.ornl.gov>). Dr. Chesler leads the GeneWeaver project for cross species integrative functional genomics at JAX and continues her research on systems genetics and genomics of behavior.

In 1999, Donna McNeil sold her gallery and home in Massachusetts, and moved her life and livelihood to Maine. Just four years later, she started working with the Maine Arts Commission (<https://mainearts.maine.gov>), and in 2009, she became the director of the organization. During her time there, McNeil initiated the Good Idea Grant (<http://mainearts.maine.gov/Pages/Grants/Good-Idea-Grant-Recipients>), seed money that helped fund artist-led projects across the state. Under McNeil's leadership, the Maine Arts Commission helped to establish Maine as the state that boasted the highest individual award for artists, \$13,000 in five genres, given annually. She oversaw the creation of Creative Communities•Equal Economic Development, which provides funding for communities to foster their creative industry and work collectively with government, business, and the arts. After retiring from her post at the commission in 2013, McNeil has continued to support the arts in Maine, serving on the board of directors at Friends of the Blaine House (<http://www.blainehouse.org>), on the grant committee at Maine Women's Fund (<http://www.mainewomensfund.org>), and on the Insight Committee at Space Gallery.



Born in northern England, Mick Womersley served in the Royal Air Force from 1978-1985 as an aircraft technician and mountain rescue specialist. He guided in Montana for two years prior to attending the University of Montana for a biology degree and a Resource Conservation from the Forestry School. He then went on to the University of Maryland Policy School, where he studied under Peter G. Brown, Herman Daly, Mark Sagoff, Steve Fetter, and Carmen Reinhart, among other important academics working in the nexus between sustainability, ethics, and economics. He graduated with distinctions in normative analysis and economics in the year 2002, following successful completion of a dissertation on American religiosity and climate science acceptance. After a short stint at the University of Georgia's Institute of Ecology, Mick came to Unity College (<http://www.unity.edu/news/unity-college-search-and-rescue-team-look-behind-scenes>) to help develop the sustainability programs in the year 2000. He teaches classes in climate change, sustainability, economics, and energy. His current research interests are in wind power assessment and mapping. Each summer he runs a field program in wind measurements to support this work, using students as crew members.
