The program is for moms and families that are financially disadvantaged to get free help from a nurse/partner that visits their home, helps with nutrition, safety in the home, and best practices to get mom and baby off to the best start. Ochoa says they stay with mom for up to two years after the baby is born. They also help with making sure mom and the family are self-sufficient, providing referrals to other agencies they may reach out to for additional services.</p>

Hamilton says youth many times these youth have never had a chance to shop for new clothes, so San Antonio threads offers them to pick out clothes that they like with their own personal shopper. The youth are referred to the organization, and pick out their clothes, just like a regular clothing store. The youth can shop twice a year. The new clothes often help them with their self-esteem, and for the older youth, find clothes that will help them obtain a job, and gain self-sufficiency. Hamilton says they also have a chance to mentor these youth while they're shopping, many times making a huge impact in the child's life.</p>

Hook spent years counseling foster children as a mental health professional. “We’re not always looking at it from the adoptee’s side,” she warns, for example, repeatedly calling one’s adoption a ‘gift’ can unintentionally hurt your child. <a href="#">Vanessa Joy Walker</a> is an author and lifecoach who was herself adopted as a baby. “The issues of identity and abandonment are interwoven into who I am, they are part of what I call my emotional DNA.” Billie Branham reports.

And, along with the fostering, we have adopted children as well. We have eight kids under-our-roof that are adopted – ages 21 to 6 – (she smiles), so it’s been a busy household, but we enjoy it. It’s a blessing, and we believe that we’re being obedient to God’s calling on our lives.” The Dungys believe it’s critically important to say ‘yes’ to God, when you’re convinced it’s God calling you. Their life experiences with fostering and adoption, as well as marriage and serving God, are detailed in their new jointly-written book “Uncommon Influence: Saying Yes to a Purposeful Life.” Tony explains, “We just think that Christianity – people can say ‘it’s weird,’ people can say it’s different, but Jesus said, ‘We go down a narrow road,’ and the path is not the broad path that the whole world is on. So, we choose to look at that as not weird or different...but, <i>uncommon</i>. That’s the first word in the book title. As for the second word: <i>influence</i>, “We wanted to let people know that they can have an influence in their world in a lot of different ways.” Learn some</p>

So, Melissa began <a href="#">Can Play</a>, an organization that lets kids with health and special needs issues play sports and have lots of fun. Jack suffered six strokes when he was just 8 years old, which left his left him with cognitive delays, partial paralysis and 'limited ability to play.' Can Play gives kids like Jack "a place that they can come, be themselves, learn about their bodies and what their bodies can do." Melissa says families are often told how their kids will not be able to do certain things. But with Can Play, they show kids they 'can do it,' no matter what. Melissa says it has been "awe inspiring" to see Jack work to overcome his challenges. She admits getting her strength from Jack, looking at the confidence and inspiration he conveys despite his physical setbacks. "You can do this, stay strong," says Jack. He reminds others even he had bad days, but to keep working hard at what they do and to "never give up."</p>
