Generics can cost 80% less than name brands. Since it's back to school time and there is a shortage of Epi-Pen allergy medicine, several ideas are being explored to improve supply. The FDA says all three makers of the product have supply but there are areas who still don't have access. Some schools don't have them in supply, and some families have to call several pharmacies in order to track them down. Because of the shortage, the FDA is extending certain Epi-Pen expiration dates.</p>

You’re not alone if you feel stressed about it. Here are some expert tips to help carry away the stress heading into week one of the new year. Dr. Angelica Ha, pediatrician with Kaiser Permanente, says proper amounts of sleep will, in itself, alleviate some of the stress. Some kids change their sleep habits during the summer months. Dr. Ha says, “Experts recommend that you start adjusting their sleep schedules about two weeks before school is starting. So what you would do is start moving that bedtime up about 5, 10, or 15 minutes a day, so you eventually get to where you want to be for the start of school.” Doing some prep work is key. But that goes beyond sleep schedules. Dr. Ha says good preparation can also help morning stress levels. She offers another tip. “You might want to start packing lunches the night before and have it already prepared. All the things that don’t need to be refrigerated can go into the lunch box. I even make my water bottles the day before, put tons of ice so that it’s still ready to go the next morning.” Transitioning to a new school or graduating from elementary to middle or middle to high school can make students anxious. Dr. Ha says you can help ease their minds, “Sometimes we’ll have students, even just practice doing that drive to the school so they know what the drop off looks like. They know what the front door looks like. And then now, there’s so many pictures on the Internet. And so for those younger kids, that anxiety can be allayed by just simply, kin of giving a heads up about what’s coming.”</p>
