WETA-FM and WGMS-FM cover areas of interest for the greater Washington, Frederick and Hagerstown communities through broadcasts produced by NPR and PBS. These programs are selected for quality and appropriate content, presentation and technical excellence, with our audience – real and potential – in mind.

We continue to broadcast NPR's "From the Top." From the Top is a non-profit organization that encourages and celebrates the commitment of young people to music and the arts through a variety of media, including nationally broadcast radio shows. The show aims to entertain, educate and connect young musicians, their parents and teachers. It features young musicians who, along with the host, Chris O'Reilly, demonstrate that classical music has a place in youth culture.

We also continue to broadcast PBS' NewsHour, a news program hosted by Gwen Ifill and Judy Woodruff that airs each weekday from 7-8 PM. NewsHour presents coverage of a wide range of subjects, as below:

Supreme Court Justice Antonin Scalia passed away in February, and there was a lot of debate about whether or not President Obama should nominate the next justice. Many Republican Senators have said they would ignore the President's choice until a new president has been elected. President Obama proceeded, despite these statements, and announced his nomination for Merrick B. Garland, who is presently the chief judge on the Federal Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit Court. A group of teachers in California challenged, before the Supreme Court, a state law that requires all teachers to pay union fees, whether or not they are a member of the union. The Court's vote on this decision was split 4-4, largely in part due to the death of Justice Scalia, which led the Court to decide that the law is constitutional. While the unions have won that round, there are still many more cases to be heard regarding this issue in the lower courts. The Supreme Court is also weighing a case that challenges a Texas law regarding abortion clinics. Essentially, the Court is looking to see whether or not this law is creating an "undue burden" to obtain an abortion in Texas. In addition, SCOTUS also heard its fourth challenge to the Affordable Care Act. Various religious groups are challenging the act because they believe that the contraceptive aspect violates their beliefs. The Supreme Court is also looking into President Obama's Immigration Actions to decide if he "overstepped his authority by deferring deportation and securing work rights for 4 million undocumented immigrants, an action opposed by 26 states."

One of the major headlines in National News has been the Flint, Michigan water crisis. For over a year and a half, residents of Flint, Michigan, including hundreds of children, have been exposed to lead-contaminated water after the city decided to change its water source in order to save millions of dollars. State officials told the residents that the water was fine, even after thousands of complaints were raised regarding its toxicity. Eventually, Governor Rick Snyder declared a state of emergency, but this was after much of the damage had already been done. Presently, there is an investigation underway to determine if anyone was at fault or had knowledge of the tainted water. There are many individuals and agencies under investigation, but many question Gov. Snyder's level of involvement, as well as the EPA. With all of the issues and protests surrounding the deadly police shootings recently, many police departments are looking to reform their tactics. Many departments have been holding training sessions to review cases where force is necessary and where it is not. However, many agree that more needs to be done on this front. While there is a process of federal review when a deadly police shooting occurs, this review only includes suggestions of police reforms and does not actually require the police department to change anything. Another big headline in National News was President Obama's trip to Cuba. He is the first sitting president since Calvin Coolidge to visit the country. During his trip, Obama urged Congress to lift the trade embargo with Cuba, although this is not likely to happen until Cuba starts making some serious changes in regards to human rights violations. President Obama has also said that he is moving to shut down Guantanamo Bay and return control to Cuba. This would mean that the current prisoners would be moved state-side, a move that many members of Congress disagree with, which could mean that the President will have to issue this order through executive action. President Obama is also looking to reform solitary confinement in all U.S. prisons, and to ban the act all together for juvenile prisoners. Apple was also in the headlines regarding the "privacy vs. security" battle. Essentially, the FBI wanted a New York court to rule that Apple had to create a "back door" to unlock an iPhone that belonged to one of the San Bernandino shooters. The court ruled in favor of the FBI, but Apple challenged this ruling saying that it sets a bad precedent, and if they were to create a key that could unlock an iPhone, it could be an international disaster if it fell into the wrong hands. Transgender rights continue to be a national issue, with states such as South Dakota and North Carolina passing laws that do not allow people who identify as transgender to use the bathroom of the sex that they identify with. Fiscal issues were also an important aspect of this quarter, with fluctuating interest rates and high-interest loans being hot topics of debate. There was also a 2.6 million increase in the number of jobs at the end of 2015; however, wage rates remained the same.

The civil war in Syria has had an international impact as scores of refugees are fleeing in search of a safe haven. The Syrian government and other armed forces have made it difficult for aid workers to help those in need. The U.S. and Russia have also been carrying out airstrikes in Syria against the Islamic State and other terrorist organizations, which have added to the chaos. Recently, both countries agreed to a cease-fire in hopes that this will be the first steps toward the end of the conflict. There has been a lot of backlash across the world about allowing refugees into varying countries due to security and economic concerns. Although peace talks have begun in Geneva, many wonder how

long this conflict will actually last and if their country has the means to support the refugees pouring in seeking asylum. Those that oppose the welcoming of refugees are also concerned that terrorist organizations, such as ISIS, will use this crisis as an opportunity to gain easier access to countries where they hope to commit terrorist acts. This is of particular concern in European countries, especially after the bombings by ISIS in Paris last year. Nearly 4 months after these attacks, the main suspect in the Paris attacks, Salah Abdeslam, was arrested in Belgium. Shortly after his arrest, bombings at the airport and subway station in Brussels were carried out by ISIS, leaving 31 people dead and hundreds of others injured. Belgian authorities carried out a series of raids following these attacks, and arrested several individuals believed to be involved in terror plots. On Easter Sunday, a Taliban suicide bomber targeted Christians at a park in Lahore, Pakistan, killing dozens of men, women and children. Iran also agreed to halt its nuclear production and release four Iranian-Americans, including Washington Post reporter Jason Rezaian, in exchange for the release of 7 Iranians being held in the U.S. and the dismissal of charges against 14 other Iranian fugitives. Vice President Biden visited Israel to meet with Israeli and Pakistani leaders to encourage peace talks between the countries and to discuss America's relations with Israel after the nuclear deal made with Iran. The United Nations imposed harsh sanctions on North Korea after it was discovered to have been carrying out nuclear tests. The hope is that these sanctions will prevent North Korea from accessing the materials needed to carry out these tests. There has also been some tension between the U.S. and China due to a number of issues, including, China's economic slowdown and their less-than-hasty response in regards to the UN-imposed sanctions on North Korea. Headlines have also focused on the South American drug trade. El Chapo, a ringleader of the Sinaloa Cartel in Mexico, was finally captured in early January, after he escaped a Mexican prison. In an interview with Sean Penn, via Rolling Stone, El Chapo admitted to sending large amounts of various illegal drugs across the Mexican-U.S. border. Presently, the United States is looking to have him extradited for these crimes.

Media, Arts and Culture focused on social issues, such as: equality of the justice system, racial diversity, gender equality and standards of beauty. The Netflix documentary series, *Making a Murderer*, was a huge topic of conversation early this year. The series tells the story of Steven Avery and how he was wrongfully convicted of rape, only to later be put back in prison for murder. Many are convinced of Avery's innocence, and the series brings up the question of how fair our justice system actually is. Another big headline in the media was the Oscar nomination list. Many celebrities and entertainers boycotted the Oscars due to the lack of racial diversity on the Oscar ballot, protesting their disdain for the award show with the hashtag #OscarsSoWhite. Beyonce also made headlines with her Super Bowl halftime performance, in which she and her back-up dancers wore costumes that were strikingly similar to those worn by the Blank Panther party. Some applauded her performance, saying it was a celebration of African-American culture; others were offended by the choice of costumes and saw it as an act of racism. Gender Equality continues to be a prominent cultural conversation. Five members of the U.S. women's soccer team filed a complaint with the Equal Employment

Opportunity Commission and are suing the league for wage discrimination, stating that they make "four times less than their male counterparts despite generating \$20 million more in revenue." Barbie also made headlines when Mattel announced that the bestselling doll will now come in more realistic body shapes and sizes. The NFL also made a major breakthrough by hiring its first female coach in the history of the organization. Kathryn Smith will be the new special teams coach for the Buffalo Bills starting in the 2016 season. Over the past few years, Seaworld has been at the center of headlines and controversy concerning its Orca breeding program. The documentary, Blackfish, focused on the captivity of killer whales at the theme park, and examined the practices that were being utilized to train the whales and the effects that captivity had on them. Ever since the release of the documentary, Seaworld has faced extreme backlash from various groups to end their theatrical shows and breeding program. Due to harsh criticism and a huge drop in park sales, Seaworld announced that they will no longer be breeding Orca whales in captivity, and that they are planning to phase out the shows by 2017. While they are still keeping the whales that they currently have in captivity, this was seen as a major victory for animal rights groups across the country, and for the animals themselves.

Health and Healthcare reports highlighted National and International developments. Heroin and opiates continue to be a national issue, with state and federal officials now trying to find new ways to tackle this epidemic. Some states are trying to focus on opening more treatment centers for those battling substance abuse problems, while others say the way to battle the issue head on is to start at the source. Many blame the opiate abuse outbreak on the over-prescribing of prescription painkillers. If prescription painkillers and the doctors who prescribe them were more regulated by the federal government, many officials say we would begin to see dramatic decreases in opiaterelated fatalities. President Obama also announced that there will be an increase in drug treatment centers across the country, as well as, the drugs that help combat the effects of opioids. An international health issue that made headlines was the Zika Virus, which is a mosquito-borne virus that started to break-out in Central and South America earlier this year. The virus is especially dangerous for pregnant women, as it has been known to cause severe birth defects. National headlines also continue to focus on ways that Americans can live healthier lives. The U.S. federal government revised some of its dietary guidelines this year by reducing the amount of sugar and red meat, but allowing some drinking of alcohol and coffee. Fitness accessories have also become the latest health craze, and many believe these will have a positive impact on health because people will be able to constantly check their data in real time. The "Tips from Former Smoker" TV ads also seem to be having a positive impact, with 400,000 people being able to kick the habit since the ads started airing. The U.S. Preventative Services Task Force is also calling for more depression screenings during and after pregnancy, as postpartum depression is being seen as more common than previously believed. In addition, the American Academy of Pediatrics is calling for children to be screened for poverty during their routine check-ups, because this can lead to other health issues which may be able to be prevented. Cancer also continues to be a major headline in the

national news, with Vice President Joe Biden calling for more research and initiatives on this front. Researchers are looking at elephants to possibly help them in the fight against cancer. Even though elephants have 100 times more cells than the average human does, less than 5% of elephants actually die from cancer. Scientists believe this is due to their "abundance of cell-suppressing genes," which could be a potential answer in our quest to cure the disease.

Regarding the Military, the Pentagon is preparing to do a complete overhaul of all of the United States' nuclear weapons, which officials say is "essential for national defense and deterrence." The U.S. military is also continuing its fight against ISIS and has successfully eliminated several leaders of the terrorist regime. U.S. forces also continue to support Iraqi and Kurdish forces as they also fight to eliminate ISIS. Army Sergeant Bowe Bergdahl, will face a court-martial regarding his decision in 2009 to leave his post, which subsequently led to his being captured by the Taliban. Care of U.S. veterans has long been a topic of debate in today's society. Today, many U.S. veterans, who were injured during combat, are coming home to start a family but are being denied assistance for invitro fertilization. This essentially leaves the vets and their spouses with mountains of medical expenses, or no children, neither option being ideal for someone wanting to move on with their life. On the other hand, the nonprofit Posse Foundation is sending military vets to elite schools across the country to obtain their college degrees and further their education.

Politics and Campaigns continued to be dominated by the 2016 candidates for President, their debates, primary election results, and polls. The front-runners have stayed consistent throughout the polls and primaries. Donald Trump, despite backlash against his hate speech and protests at his rallies, continues to be the frontrunner for the Republican candidacy. The race for the Republican nomination has lost a few contenders, with Ben Carson and Marco Rubio being the latest hopefuls to drop out. Senator Ted Cruz continues to be Trump's biggest competition. Hilary Clinton is also leading the polls for the Democratic nomination ahead of Bernie Sanders. Many leaders of the GOP are against a Trump nomination, and some have been strategizing ways to keep the reality star out of the White House. In fact, Mitt Romney gave a speech recently stating that Trump is "a phony" and "a fraud," and he does not support him for the GOP nomination. Violence has been known to break out at Trump rallies, and Trump's campaign manager, Corey Lewandowski, was recently charged with the assault of a reporter following one of Trump's speeches. Trump's rivals also continue to focus on his controversial comments in hopes that support for the candidate will begin to decrease. In other political news, President Obama held his last State of the Union address in January. The President used this opportunity to call out some of the things being said on the campaign trail that he disagreed with, including, the state of the nation's economy and Trump's fear-inducing rhetoric.

Reports on Education examined the issues surrounding college in the United States. Reports are now saying that college applications should limit the amount of AP classes and extracurricular activities that students can list, and instead focus on the passions of the students so that they become more involved in things that can actually make a difference in their lives and in their communities. Studies are also beginning to question whether or not the SAT is a good indicator of college success, which leads to the question of whether or not it should be used on college applications. With the rise in student loan debts, many also wonder if college is worth the expense or if students should skip it altogether and go straight to work-force training. Other new developments in Education are, enabling buses with Wi-Fi so all students have internet access and the reformation of inadequate schools and special education programs.
