WETA-FM and WGMS-FM cover areas of interest for the greater Washington, Frederick and Hagerstown communities through broadcasts produced by NPR and PBS. These programs are selected for quality and appropriate content, presentation and technical excellence, with our audience – real and potential – in mind.

We continue to broadcast NPR's "From the Top." From the Top is a non-profit organization that encourages and celebrates the commitment of young people to music and the arts through a variety of media, including nationally broadcast radio shows. The show aims to entertain, educate and connect young musicians, their parents and teachers. It features young musicians who, along with the host, Chris O'Reilly, demonstrate that classical music has a place in youth culture.

We also continue to broadcast PBS' NewsHour, a news program hosted by Judy Woodruff that airs each weekday from 7-8 PM. NewsHour presents coverage of a wide range of subjects, as below:

The Supreme Court began its most unusual term with an empty seat since the death of Antonin Scalia last February. It has been at least 25 years since the court began a term with only eight members. Court watcher Marcia Coyle of "The National Law Journal" shares that, "there are not potential blockbuster issues on the docket" and "the cases we're seeing, there is a healthy dose of patent, arbitration, bankruptcy, and there are more narrow technical statutory interpretation cases." There are a few potential blockbuster issues that they may take on, such as the "Trinity Lutheran Church in Missouri is challenging Missouri's denial of state grants to it to resurface a playground, claiming that it discriminates against religious institutions, that violates the First Amendment." Or the "Oregon rock group the Slants is involved in a trademark case. Their mark was turned down by a federal agency because it disparaged Asian Americans. A federal appellate court struck that law down as violating the Constitution. The Obama administration is asking the Supreme Court to take a look at it." Marcia Coyle adds, "There's a petition from a Virginia county school board that's challenging a lower court's order that a transgender boy should be able to use the boys' bathroom."

In National News, this quarter, the entire PBS Newshour, Washington Week and WETA family, President Obama, as well as the nation said goodbye to one our own. Gwen Ifill, our managing editor, heart and soul passed away on Monday, November 14, 2016 after a battle with cancer. She was a supernova in a profession loaded with smart and talented people.

From the White House President Obama shares, "Michelle and I want to offer our deepest condolences to Gwen Ifill's family and all of you, her colleagues, on her passing. Gwen was a friend of ours. She was an extraordinary journalist. She always kept faith with the fundamental responsibilities of her profession, asking tough questions, holding people in power accountable, and defending a strong and free press that makes our democracy work. I always appreciated Gwen's reporting, even when I was at the receiving end of one of her tough and thorough interviews. Whether she reported from a convention floor or from the field, whether she sat at the debate moderator's table or at the anchor's desk, she not only informed today's citizens, but she also inspired tomorrow's journalists. She was an especially powerful role model for young women and girls, who admired her integrity, her tenacity and her intellect, and for whom she blazed a trail as one-half of the first all-female anchor team on network news. So, Gwen did her country a great service. Michelle and I join her family and her colleagues and everybody else who loved her in remembering her fondly today."

Gwen Ifill was a pioneering figure in American journalism who quite literally changed the face of the evening news. She met discrimination and bigotry with talent and focus, rising to become one of the most prominent journalists

of her generation. She pursued her reporting with grace, intelligence and integrity, earning her the trust of countless Americans who counted on her to present the facts of the story without slant or spin. She asked tough questions and told hard truths, but she always did so in a way that elevated, rather than coarsened, our national discourse. Our country is a better place because of her commitment to the truth, and she will be sorely missed, both on the air and off.”

Jim Lehrer remembers, “She was a superb professional, somebody who understood the need to be civil, understand the need to be honest, the need to do your homework, and the need to be tough when required, to be soft when required and more importantly, always to be yourself which Gwen always was.” Margaret Warner added, “We shared a journalist’s passion for explaining to our audience how the world works, but with honesty and care, not cynicism. Most precious of all was her wise counsel, reminding me in tough times to rely on family, friends and faith. They were the greatest source of Gwen’s gusto and joy.” Lastly, Sara Just, Executive Producer of the PBS Newshour, shares that “there is a huge gaping hole in our newsroom and in the industry of journalism in general without Gwen. She was one of a kind. But she also planted a lot of seeds. She was a mentor, a guide, a friend to a whole slew of younger journalists. She made time in her busy schedule to offer advice, be a sounding board, a cheerleader an ally.”

In International News, a 21-gun salute launched Cuba’s week of mourning for Fidel Castro, who passed away on the night of Friday, November 25, 2016 at the age of 90. But in Miami, it was a day of celebration for the many who see the former leader’s death as the conclusion of a violent and oppressive era. Jeffrey Brown spoke with Senator Amy Klobuchar (D-Minn.) and The Heritage Foundation’s Ana Quintana about what’s next for Cuba and its relationship with the U.S.

Wednesday, November 30, 2016 Fidel Castro’s ashes began a lengthy procession through Cuba, mirroring the legendary leader’s post-revolution journey in 1959. At the time, Castro depicted himself as a national savior -- a view some Cubans still hold today. Hari Sreenivasan spoke with special correspondent Nick Schifrin in Havana for a report on the response to Castro’s death and hopes for the country’s future.

As many hoped the brutal fighting in Aleppo, Syria, seemed to be over. But on the morning of December 15, 2016, President Assad’s artillery resumed attacking those still trapped. Evacuations of civilians and fighters began immediately, the devastation of four years of war laid bare. Dan Rivers of Independent Television News reported on this story as well as, spoke with Hari Sreenivasan about what’s left.

In Politics this quarter, amid a slew of mud-slinging, misuse of emails and sexual accusations -- the nation spoke on November 8, 2016. Donald Trump, a businessman, television personality, author, politician along with Mike Pence, Governor of Indiana will be sworn in as our 45th President and Vice President in January of 2017. Hillary Rodham Clinton and Senator Tim Kaine conceded by wishing them well.

In Health, dire dental problems and other health issues keep the nonprofit Remote Area Medical busy running free clinics, particularly in states that didn’t expand Medicaid. Even after Obamacare, large coverage gaps still exist in the nation’s health care system. Special correspondent Sarah Varney reports from southwestern Virginia, an impoverished region where many still turn to charity for basic needs.

In the midst of radical changes in health care policy, some U.S. providers are looking to an unlikely model: Sub-Saharan Africa, where ordinary citizens are trained as medical support for their communities. In the U.S., City Health Works is following suit, using community members to form long-term relationships with patients to fill gaps in care. Special correspondent Sarah Varney reports.

On November 8, multiple states legalized the use of marijuana for either recreational or medicinal purposes -- thus marking a major shift in U.S. drug policy. William Brangham spoke with Taylor West of the National Cannabis Administration and Jonathan Hudak of the Brookings Institution about marijuana law and how it might evolve under President-elect Donald Trump’s upcoming administration.
