WETA-FM and WGMS-FM cover areas of interest for the greater Washington, Frederick and Hagerstown communities through broadcasts produced by NPR and PBS. These programs are selected for quality and appropriate content, presentation and technical excellence, with our audience – real and potential – in mind.

We continue to broadcast NPR's "From the Top." From the Top is a non-profit organization that encourages and celebrates the commitment of young people to music and the arts through a variety of media, including nationally broadcast radio shows. The show aims to entertain, educate and connect young musicians, their parents and teachers. It features young musicians who, along with the host, Chris O'Reilly, demonstrate that classical music has a place in youth culture.

We also continue to broadcast PBS' NewsHour, a news program hosted by Gwen Ifill and Judy Woodruff that airs each weekday from 7-8 PM. NewsHour presents coverage of a wide range of subjects, as below:

The Supreme Court weighed in on several cases this quarter including hearing arguments in a challenge to President Obama's actions that would defer deportations of many undocumented immigrants. However, due to the passing of Supreme Court Justice Antonin Scalia, earlier this year, the court was divided, resulting in the case being sent to down to Federal Court. A few top senators released a bipartisan bill to reform the nation's criminal justice system. The bill will reduce prison sentencing for some non-violent drug offenders and assist former prisoners with re-entry into society. There are also plans to educate law enforcers on how to recognize and respond to people with mental health issues.

The Justices confirmed the constitutionality of a college affirmative action program, but deadlocked on President Obama's executive action protecting millions of unauthorized immigrants from deportation, thus nullifying the order. Abortion rights groups say the Supreme Court's ruling against Texas' stringent restrictions on abortion doctors and clinics was a major blow against "sham" laws trying to take away a woman's right to choose. "The Justices voted 5-3 to strike down a Texas law that imposed tight restrictions on family planning centers and doctors who perform the procedure. Abortion rights groups were ecstatic and both sides have vowed to continue to fight."

As the Supreme Court wrapped up a very busy term, Solicitor General Donald Berrilli, the Obama administration's top lawyer who defended Obamacare and argued for immigration reform, announced that he will not be returning next fall.

In National Affairs news, the U.S. mourns the passing of Prince and Muhammad Ali. April 21, 2016, Prince was found dead at his Minneapolis-area estate, but cause of death was not immediately clear. A subsequent autopsy later revealed that his death stemmed from an apparent overdose of fentanyl a powerful opioid painkiller. Prince Rogers Nelson was 57 years old. Muhammad Ali, the three-time World Heavyweight Champion boxer and civil rights activist, died in a Phoenix-area hospital from respiratory complications. The 74 year old, who had a 32 year battle with Parkinson's disease, will be remembered for his many accomplishments but also for his famous quote: "Float like a Butterfly, Sting like a Bee."

The Treasury Department announced last month that Harriet Tubman will grace the \$20 bill instead of Andrew Jackson. Tubman, an "icon of American courage and freedom" was an American abolitionist, humanitarian and an armed scout and spy for the United States Army.

A new Pew analysis finds that the middle class has shrunk in their ranks since 2000, and that, in at least 160 metro areas, there has been a rise in both the lower and upper class families. The middle class make from \$47,000 to

about \$125,000, and are our nation's consumers. Wages have been stagnant, which means there is more income inequality forcing more to the lower and higher end of the scales, and thinning out the middle. In today's economy, even two income families struggle to make ends meet. Often times an unexpected expense is enough to exhaust their savings and push them right into paycheck-to-paycheck living, and ultimately the lower class.

This quarter in International Affairs Great Britain voted 52 to 48 percent to become the first nation to leave the European Union. The vote prompted Prime Minister David Cameron to announce his resignation. To ensure a smooth transition he has agreed to stay on until October.

Navy SEAL Charles Keating died in a firefight with Islamic State militants in northern Iraq on Tuesday, May 3rd. His death comes as the U.S. decides to move in more troops and materiel to support the Iraqi military offensive against the terror group. At the same time there is political turmoil in Baghdad, where the government of Prime Minister Haider al-Abadi is facing challenges from rival Shia groups.

In Health News, Puerto Rico continues to not only battle the mosquito-borne Zika virus, but also to keep it from gaining ground. The U.S. Centers for Disease Control predicts an astounding 20 percent of the island's 3.5 million people will likely contract Zika this year.

The White House issued a \$1.9 billion plan for combating the Zika virus in the U.S., including provisions for mosquito control, education and research into a vaccine. A 49-year old Pennsylvania woman was found carrying a strain of E. coli that is resistant to last-resort antibiotics. Researchers say this marks the first appearance of a drug-proof bacteria on U.S. soil. Scientists in Pennsylvania are working with the Centers for Disease Control to find a way to fight the superbug.

According to a new study from the World Health Organization, diabetes cases have quadrupled over the last 40 years, mostly in poorer nations. Eight and a half percent of all adults worldwide suffer from the chronic disease, and 3.7 million deaths are linked every year. A couple of ways to control diabetes is to make an effort to eat healthy and take in more physical activity.

The FDA rolled out new rules for nutrition labels on packaged foods and drinks this quarter. The labels are designed to highlight the amount of "added sugar" and calories in a given product. The measures, which take effect this summer, are part of a new effort to combat obesity and diabetes.

As summer approaches many recent high school graduates are preparing to embark on a "Gap Year." Graduates like Malia Obama have made the decision to postpone college for one year, and jump start their life and work experiences, and gain life knowledge by traveling, volunteering for mission based organizations and the like. Studies show that the Gap Year makes for better citizens; jump starts their learning and assists in centering the student. Students that participate tend to return to school more focused, determined to graduate and with a better sense of the world and those around them. Although a high percent of the students that take advantage of the "Gap year" are from upper-class and middleclass families, some schools, including Tufts University, Florida State University and the University of North Carolina have begun to offer some forms of financial aid to give cash strapped students exposure to a broader range of experiences before college as well.

According to a new study some 50 percent of all Muslim students in the U.S. have been bullied by their peers. In mostly-white St. Cloud, Minnesota, where thousands of east African refugees have relocated, the problem got so bad that Muslim students walked out of the city's high school en masse. This prompted faculty and staff to begin talks with students on ways to educate and fight Islamophobia. Meanwhile, Negin Farsad, a Palm Springs, CA resident chooses to travel the country and combat Islamophobia with comedy. Like the students and faculty in St. Cloud, Farsad brings home the teaching that it is okay to be different and Muslims are people too.
