This duPont–Columbia and Peabody-Award winning filmmaker's new documentary series, *College Behind Bars*, reveals the transformative power of higher education through the experiences of men and women trying to earn college degrees while incarcerated.

The four-hour series, distilled from nearly 400 hours of cinéma vérité footage, explores the lives of a dozen incarcerated men and women as they struggle to earn degrees in the Bard Prison Initiative (BPI), one of the most rigorous and effective prison education programs in the country. In this era of mass incarceration, America is the world's largest jailer, with more than 2 million men and women behind bars; 630,000 are released annually, and nearly 50 percent end up back in prison within five years, trapped in a cycle of imprisonment, release and reincarceration.
