He used his real name, and due to lack of any real background checks, remained employed for four months. In that short time, Bauer witnessed firsthand the horrific conditions both prisoners and guards faced at the hands of the billion-dollar private prison industry and wrote an exposé that became Mother Jones' most read piece of all time. He argues that the private prison system is rarely held accountable for the atrocities that happen quietly within its concrete walls.

When Donald Trump announced his presidential bid in 2015, conservative historian Max Boot couldn't help but think he was watching a dystopian science-fiction movie. He couldn't fathom that the party of Lincoln, Roosevelt and Reagan could endorse a reality TV star with no prior political experience and a laundry list of controversies.

This created an ideological dislocation so shattering that Boot's transformation from Republican foreign policy adviser to celebrated anti-Trump columnist is the dramatic story of his new book, The Corrosion of Conservatism.

After joining other prominent conservatives such as David Frum, Rick Wilson and Ana Navarro in denouncing Trump's candidacy and subsequent presidency, Boot left the Republican Party. No longer a Republican, but also not a Democrat, Boot's journey from a movement conservative to a man without a party is one worth hearing about. While 90 percent of his fellow Republicans endorsed President Trump's agenda in the aftermath of the 2016 election, Boot stood his ground, enduring the criticism of conservative colleagues.
