Agriculture	Morning Show Interview	3-Nov	8:15 AM	15 MINUTES	As farmers move equipment from field to field they will be traveling at much slower speeds than the rest of the motoring public. Drivers should be aware of farm vehicles and prepare to slow down when encountering them. Farm equipment, which travels at speeds of 25 mph or less, is required to have a slow moving vehicle emblem (bright orange triangle) mounted to the rear of the vehicle. If traffic begins to back up behind the farm equipment, the operator should pull over in a safe location and allow traffic to pass. Even if the farm equipment operator motions for you to pass, motorists should not attempt to pass farm equipment unless it is legal and safe to do so. And Remember, most farm equipment does not have turn signals. Often times crashes between farm equipment and passenger vehicles occur as the farm equipment is making a left turn and a passenger vehicle is passing the farm equipment on the left. When approaching farm equipment traveling in the opposite direction, be alert for impatient drivers passing at the wrong time.

Education	Morning Show Interview	13-Nov	8:15 AM	20 minutes	The Board of Education for Monmouth-Roseville School District will meet tonight at 5:45 p.m. For a truth and taxation hearing. Last month the Board approved a resolution for School Board Member Recognition Day. Approval was also given for a bid of \$843,000 from Commercial Mechanical, Inc. for HVAC work at Lincoln, Harding and the Junior High. Also approved was a life-safety amendment in the amount of \$88,800 to install a security camera at Monmouth-Roseville Junior High and the approval of a life-safety amendment in the amount of \$126,000 to install a security camera at the High School. The regularly scheduled Board of Education meeting will follow the truth and taxation meeting.
Agriculture	Morning Show Interview	22-Nov	8:15 AM	20 minutes	It was a busy weekend for the state's deer hunters. Over all the first weekend of shotgun season saw more than 54,000 deer killed. The numbers are down from last year by about four thousand. Tim Schweizer with Illinois Department of Natural Resources says that the weather may be to blame for downward trend in harvest numbers. Locally, in Henderson County 372 deer were taken in the first weekend, Warren County 382 deer were harvested and in Knox County hunters bagged 820 deer. Shotgun hunters have another chance to go out into the woods from December 1st to the 4th.
