One new law includes immunity for an underage person who calls 911 for someone who has been drinking. Monmouth Police Chief Bill Feithen says the hope in this law is that under age drinkers will be much more inclined to call for help if they know they are immune from being charged in these situations. Another law focuses on a crack down of speeding in construction, school, or maintenance zones. Aggravated speeding in Illinois is a misdemeanor charge that can lead to fines and sometimes it may even lead to jail time. This law will look to open drivers' eyes to the dangers of speeding in these zones.

The co-op is a joint agreement of seven school districts within Knox and Warren Counties cooperating to provide educational services for children with disabilities requiring specialized instruction. The schools districts include Abingdon-Avon, Galesburg, Knoxville, Monmouth-Roseville, ROWVA, United and Williamsfield. Galesburg has filed a petition that they wish to withdraw from the district. United School Superintendent Jeff Whitsett says currently they are in a holding pattern. Monmouth Roseville Superintendent Ed Fletcher says they have discussed the process and what it means for the school district and their students.
