Program Topic: Going to the Gym during COVID-19

Is it safe to go to the gym during the COVID pandemic?

"Safe" is a relative term.

Going to the gym is allowed in certain areas during COVID.

• It is considered a high risk activity because COVID spreads through droplets exhaled while breathing.

• The rapid, deep breathing that occurs during exercise makes the gym a place for potential COVID infection.

If I decide to go, how do I lower my risk?

- First and foremost, check with your gym about the precautions that they have in place.
- Make the plans to follow this rules when you get there.
- Wash your hands with soap and water or use hand sanitizer when you get into the workout area.
- Wear a mask.
- Your mask should be warn when not actively exercising.
- This means that you put your make on in-between sets.
- Clean the workout machine or weights before and after your workout.

Is there anything else I can do?

- Wash your hands again after leaving the workout area.
- Change your clothes and shower after your workout.
- Consider working out at home or even outdoors if possible.
- For example, instead of running on a treadmill, you could run through your neighborhood or at a park.
- Maintain your distance from others whether you are outside or inside.

- Exercise often and every day if possible.
- Limit sugar intake and avoid alcohol.
- Find someone you trust and talk about your feelings. This may mean visiting a counselor.
- Be willing to take a break or even a day off if you need one.
- Helping others who are struggling can even help you.
- Ask for help if you need it. Talk to a friend and if they can't help, seek a professional.

Do I need to have my ballot ready before I go vote?

• No, you can show up and do all your voting on site.

• What we are talking about is taking the time to make sure that you are informed about the issues before going to the polling location.

• This will not only make your voting process go more quickly but it also assures that you are voting the way you want to.

Where can I find information on the issues other than Google?

- You can start by finding the Board of Elections in your area.
- The BoE normally posts the ballot early so you can make some informed decisions.
- Many newspapers and news outlets will allow candidates to post answers to questionnaires on their website which can make voting easier.
- Some websites will even allow you to "vote" in advance and print out your choices so that you can take a cheat sheet with you to the polling place.
- This is also something that can be found through your local board of elections.
- Each political party also puts out information on their candidates.

Is it too late for me to register?

- This will largely depend on the area you live in.
- Register today and at least you will be sure that you can vote in the next election if not this one.
- Being registered isn't enough: you will also need to be certain to go to the correct polling place or voting location.

Program Topic: What is the Electoral College and How Does It Work?

If America is a democracy, why do we have an Electoral College?

- America is not a direct democracy.
- America is a republic.
- A republic is a form of government in which the citizens elect leaders and the leaders then represent the people in the government.

So American's don't really elect the President?

- Americans do not directly elect the President.
- Each state holds a Presidential election with one candidate winning.
- The winner of the popular vote in each state wins that state's electoral votes.
- These votes belong to the Electoral College and it elects the President.

What is the Electoral College?

- It is a group of representatives from each state that actually cast the ballots that elect the President.
- The number of Electors that each state gets is determined by the combined number of Representatives and Senators from that state.
- When a candidate wins a state, they receive all the votes from that state.
- Once a majority of votes is won in the Electoral College (even if they do not win the popular vote) that candidate becomes President.

Why use the Electoral College instead of just a popular vote?

- The Electoral College exists for the same reasons that there are two houses of Congress.
- This prevents larger states from having complete control of the government.
- It is a compromise that gives more votes for larger states but an equal number of votes for smaller states.

Are plasma donations still happening?

- Yes, it is still happening.

What is different about donating during the pandemic?

- You will be tested for COVID in order to donate.
- If you are free of COVID, you can donate as normal.
- If you have had COVID, you will receive extra money for your donation.
- Many plasma centers are actively looking for recovered COVID patients for donation.

What is the difference between giving plasma and blood?

- When you give blood, that blood is given entirely to another person.
- When you give plasma, that plasma is separated from your blood.
- The blood cells are often returned to the donor.
- The separated plasma is often used in pharmaceutical products.
- This means that it is monetized.
- This is why money is often given for plasma donations.

Is it still safe?

- Theoretically, yes.
- It will depend on the care and cautiousness of your local clinic.
- Talk to them about what they are doing to prevent COVID spread in your area.
- Ultimately, the decision of whether your local clinic is safe enough will be up to you.

- Even if your name reaches the top of the the list, those below you are getting ripped off.
- This is a form of pyramid scheme and is actually illegal.

Are there any legitimate gift exchances out there?

- Yes, there are "Secret Santa" programs on the web.
- One of the most renowned is the one that is done by Reddit each year.
- Make sure that you do plenty of research before you get involved.
- Do not give your personal or financial information to anyone.
- Be skeptical of anything you find online and look at it very carefully before you participate.

How long can I expect my leftovers to last?

- The general rule for food of all kinds is three to five days.
- Thanksgiving leftovers can be a little different.
- Each different food can have a varying shelf life from the others.

How long can we eat turkey?

- First, the leftover turkey should be refrigerated two hours after cooking.
- Take the meat off the bones before refrigerating.
- It should be left in empty, shallow pans in the refrigerator so it can cool faster.
- It should not be eaten after four days.
- To prolong its life you can freeze it. Frozen turkey can last two to six months in the freezer.

What about some of the sides?

- Homemade gravy gets two days in the fridge and two months in the freezer.
- Cranberry sauce is good for seven to fourteen days.
- Mashed potatoes, yams and green bean casseroles are good for three to five days in the fridge, or 10 to 12 months in the freezer.
- Most leftovers can be reheated and re-chilled numerous times within four days of initial cooking.

What about desserts?

- A baked pumpkin pie can be left in the fridge for three to four days, or one to two months in the freezer.
- Baked apple pies can stay in the pantry for up to two days, and then an additional two or three days in the refrigerator.

Program Topic: US Product and Safety Commission Guidelines for a Safer Christmas

Why do we need safety guidelines for Christmas?

- Christmas is full of unique activities which can lead to unique dangers and opportunities for injury.
- Over 14,000 people visited in the emergency room in North America with Christmas related injuries last year.
- Forty percent of those injuries are from falls sustained on ladders.

Ladder falls make sense but what other dangers are associated with Christmas?

- There is an increased risk of fire during the Christmas season.
- Candles are the biggest risk factor.
- Over 100 fires were caused last year by Christmas trees getting too dry.
- There was a total of almost \$70 million in damages due to tree and candle fires during the holidays in 2017.

What sort of precautions can be taken to prevent some of these dangers?

- Place trees away from vents, fireplaces, and radiators.
- If you buy a live tree, make sure it is fresh.
- If it isn't green all over, it is too dry.
- Central heat causes trees to dry out faster so make certain that you are constantly refreshing its water.
- Only buy artificial trees that are labeled as fire resistant.
- Always extinguish candles before leaving a room.
- Keep candles on stable, heat-resistant platforms that are out of the reach of children.

What are things I can continue to do to avoid COVID-19?

- The single biggest thing you can do to keep yourself safe is to stay at home and avoid unnecessary public activity.

- Studies continue to show that they are a good deterrent in the spread of the disease.
- Masks are not 100% effective but this does not mean they do not help.
- When combined with social distancing and hand washing, the cumulative effect is a reduction in the spread of COVID-19.

What is CD Project Red?

They are a video game development company in Poland.

- They are the largest developer in Europe and the second largest in the world.
- They are the creators of The Witcher and Cyberpunk 2077.

What is Cyberpunk 2077?

- Cyberpunk is their latest game that has just released.
- It is considered the most anticipated release of the year.
- It has broken records with pre-sells.

Why are they offering refunds?

- While it is hugely anticipated, Cyberpunk is also severely broken.
- On last-generation consoles such as the Playstation 4, the game is considered unplayable.
- There is a group considering a class action lawsuit.
- Video games are typically very difficult to return because most retailers will not accept a return once it is open.
- This is also true digitally as digital purchases are typically not refundable.
- As a way to save face and avert legal action, they are allowing all customers to return the game.

How can I get my refund?

- You can return your game to the store where it was purchased.
- If you bought the game digitally, you can return it through your e-tailer.
- Some stores do not have a return policy in place so you may need to talk with them and, in some cases, wait until they have something set up.

Program Topic: The COVID-19 Vaccine and trypanophobia

What is trypanophobia?

Trypanophobia is the fear of needles.

This fear extends to all needles and not just having blood drawn.

• Some fear of a needle is natural, but this is a phobia that goes before the natural aversion to pain.

How common is this fear?

- About 25% of adults are afraid of needles but only about 7% reach the "phobia" level of this fear.
- Sixteen percent of adult patients avoid getting vaccines because of a fear of needles.
- This includes 26% of health care workers.

How does this relate to COVID-19?

- The COVID-19 vaccine is only available through an injection.
- Injections (obviously) involve needles.
- If a person is afraid of needles and avoids the vaccine, they are potentially putting themselves at risk.

What are things we can do to overcome our fear of needles?

- Practice deep breathing and visualize yourself in a comfortable place.
- Think about why you are doing it.
- The outcome may be worth the momentary fear and pain.
- Distract yourself by closing your eyes or finding something on the wall to stare at.
- Don't watch the injection. Keep your eyes on something else.
