Mona Charen, syndicated columnist and author of "Sex Matters: How Modern Feminism Lost Touch with Science, Love and Common Sense," tackles the controversial subject addressing the serious decline in women's happiness. Citing key studies and statistics, Charen shows how, despite many significant gains for women in the last decades, including the right to vote and more equal treatment and payment in the workplace, those advances have not resulted in women being happier and, in fact, the happiness of women has actually shown to be decreasing. Charen, who describes herself as an "Equity Feminist," celebrates the advance of Women's Rights but argues Feminism has been "at war with Nature."

Christina Paxson, the President of Brown University, addresses recent concerns raised about free speech rights on college campuses and the extreme burden that college tuition brings on many students and their families.
